

PASTOR'S LETTER

PRAYER FOR THE LEGAL PROTECTION OF UNBORN CHILDREN

From January 16 to 24, 2025, "9 Days for Life," a novena promoted by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, will take place, focusing on the protection of human life and the end of abortion. In the Catholic Church in the United States, January 22 is designated as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children." As Catholics, we are called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. The Church gathers to pray for the protection of all unborn children and to perform acts of reparation for abortion, trusting that the Lord will hear our prayers. Pope Saint John Paul II wrote: "A great prayer for life, which will encompass the whole world, is urgently needed. May an impassioned plea rise to God, the Creator and lover of life, from every Christian community, from every group or association, from every family and from the heart of every believer, through extraordinary initiatives and through ordinary prayer" (*Evangelium vitae*, 100). Our fidelity to Christ calls us to defend and protect the inviolable dignity and sanctity of all human life from the moment of conception until natural death. In recent years, great strides have been made to protect women and their unborn children. A healthy society can only flourish if it is based on a consistent recognition of the rights of every individual, especially the weakest and most defenseless. With this in mind, we must commit ourselves to seeking full legal protection for unborn children, and we continue to support efforts to provide practical assistance and support to women and their families who experience difficulties during and after pregnancy. Bishop Daniel E. Thomas of Toledo, who chairs the Committee on Pro-Life Activities of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), stated the

following: "This January 22nd and beyond, we need to be assured that Jesus himself, who is the source of our hope, was the first to be wounded by our offenses and suffered for each of our sins, including abortion. Let us unite in prayer with a novena so that God may fill the hearts of mothers and fathers who suffer the emotional and psychological wounds of abortion with the hope of forgiveness that only He can give." The recitation of this novena began in 2013 to commemorate the 40th anniversary of *Roe v. Wade*, the Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion throughout the United States. While the Court's 2022 decision in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization* returned the issue of abortion to the people's elected representatives at the federal and state levels, the USCCB reminds us that "ongoing efforts are needed to protect children and their mothers from the tragedy of abortion." Here are some additional suggestions for acts of reparation to offer while imploring God for an end to abortion:

- Abstain from snacking between meals. Limit yourself to three meals a day.
- Pray the Angelus and consider saying it every day for the next week: upon waking, at noon, or at 6 p.m. (or all three times).
- Offer some other sacrifice, prayer, or act of penance that you feel called to do for today's intention.

May this novena of prayer and acts of reparation rise from our hearts today and every day forward until every human being is protected by law and welcomed into life.

Part I : A Time for Every Purpose Living the Faith through the Precepts of the Church

Time is one of God's greatest gifts. From the first light of creation to the final breath of our lives, every moment is held in His loving plan. Time is not merely something that passes, it is something sacred, a vessel of grace through which God invites us to love, to grow, and to serve. The Book of Ecclesiastes reminds us:

"There is an appointed time for everything, and a time for every affair under the heavens."
(Ecclesiastes 3:1)

Every season of life carries purpose. There is a time to plant seeds of faith, a time to nurture them with prayer, a time to bear fruit in service, and a time to rest in gratitude for what God has done. The question is not whether we have time, but how we choose to spend it.

The Church offers us guidance for living our time well through the Precepts of the Church, which help us remain rooted in faith and connected to the life of grace. They are not burdens or rules to be endured, but signposts that direct our hearts toward God.

The Precepts of the Church

Attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.

Each Sunday is a sacred pause in our week, when heaven touches earth. At Mass, we offer our time back to the One who gave it to us. Worship keeps our hearts centered on God's eternal love.

Confess your sins at least once a year.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation allows us to begin again. In confession, time becomes a moment of healing and grace, where we are renewed in God's mercy.

Receive the Eucharist at least once during the Easter season.

The Eucharist nourishes us with Christ's presence. To receive Him is to be strengthened for the journey of faith

Observe the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence.

Fasting helps us slow down and reflect. It teaches us to hunger for God, not just for food, and to create space in our time for spiritual renewal.

Contribute to the support of the Church.

Stewardship reminds us that everything we have, our time, talent, and treasure, comes from God. By giving generously, we help the Church continue her mission in our community and beyond.

Participate in the Church's mission of evangelization of souls.

Each of us is called to share the Gospel. Whether through words, actions, or quiet witness, we can bring the light of Christ into the world. Evangelization is one of the most beautiful ways we can spend our time.

These precepts ground us in the rhythm of faith, worship, repentance, renewal, and service. They remind us that holiness is not lived in grand gestures, but in consistent, faithful living.

Next week, we'll reflect on how we can make our time fruitful through the Works of Mercy, using our days not only to love God, but to serve one another in His name.

Closing Prayer

Lord of all time,
teach me to treasure each moment as Your gift.
Help me to use my days to grow in faith, to serve with joy,
and to live every hour in gratitude for Your love.
Amen.


