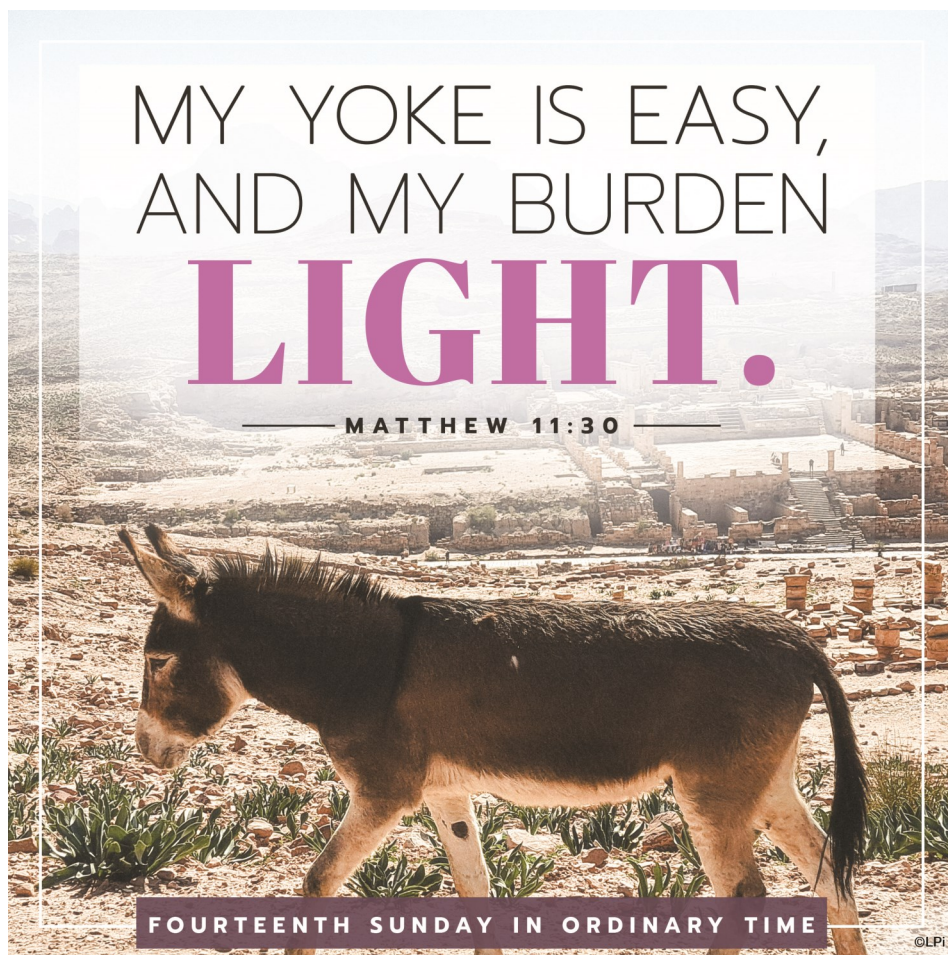

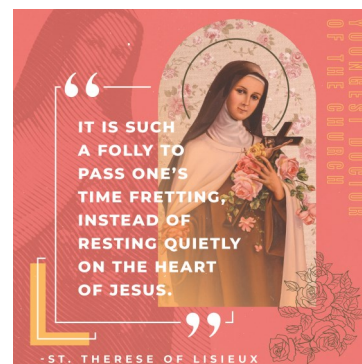

Dear people of God,
we thank the Lord for the gift of life and for all His blessings in moments of joy and sorrow. As Family Forty-Four, also known as the Five Mountains Catholic Community, I appreciate your sharing of time, talent, and treasure, especially as demonstrated at our parish picnic on June 14, 2026. This aligns with Pope Leo XIV's soccer analogy, in which everyone is invited to play a role. Indeed, Pope Leo XIV recently used a soccer analogy to help us remember something very important: “that life is not a race to be run in solitude; it is something played as a team, and we must learn to run together” (Marina, 2026, p. 1). In my mother tongue, Luganda in Uganda, we have a saying/proverb, “*Agali awamu ge galuma ennyama*,” which translates as “*the teeth that are together crush the steak*”; thus, unity is strength. May we reflect this analogy in our parishes, ministries, councils, movements, and associations across our different ecclesial communities, at Sacred Heart Battleground, St. John Vancouver, St. Philip Woodland, St. Mary Gualuaple Ridgefield, and St. Joseph the Worker Yacolt. Indeed, as we move toward becoming one canonical parish, let's continue to embrace synodality as the laity and the clergy journey together, irrespective of our uniqueness, Amen.

STEWARDSHIP SERIES – WEEK 2 “Give Me Only Your Love and Your Grace” The Gift of Time

“Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain wisdom of heart” — Psalm 90:12

Last week, we reflected on a foundational truth of stewardship: everything is gift. Our lives, faith, talents, resources, and opportunities all come from God and are entrusted to us for His glory.

Among these gifts, perhaps none is more precious than time.

Every day is a gift from God. Each morning offers a new opportunity to grow in faith, serve others, and deepen our relationship with Christ. Yet time is also the one gift we can never replace once it has passed.

The question for Christian stewards is not simply, “How much time do I have?” but rather, “How am I using the time God has given me?”

The Heart That Makes Time Holy

*“Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest.”
— Matthew 11:28*

Throughout His earthly life, Jesus made time for what mattered most. He prayed to His Father, worshipped in the synagogue, taught His disciples, healed the sick, and welcomed those who sought Him.

Even in the midst of great demands, Jesus never lost sight of His relationship with the Father.

The Sacred Heart invites us to do the same.

In a busy world filled with distractions and obligations, stewardship of time begins by placing Christ at the center of our lives. When we spend time with Him in prayer, the Eucharist, Scripture, and service, our hearts become more like His.

Reflection

St. Ignatius reminds us that all we have comes from God and is meant to be returned to Him.

One of the greatest gifts we can offer back to God is our time. We offer our time when we gather for Mass each Sunday. We offer our time when we pray with our families. We offer our time when we listen to someone who is hurting. We offer our time when we volunteer, serve, and share our gifts with others.

Stewardship of time is not about doing more. It is about allowing God to shape our priorities so that what matters most receives our attention.

The more we spend time with Christ, the more we discover that His love and grace truly are enough.

Ponder

- How do I spend the gift of time God has given me?
- Do my priorities reflect my relationship with Christ?
- When do I make time for prayer and silence?
- How is God inviting me to use my time in service to others?

Guided Prayer

Sacred Heart of Jesus,

You are Lord of all time.

Help me to use each day wisely and faithfully.

Teach me to make time for prayer, worship, and service, so that my life may reflect Your love.

May every moment draw me closer to You. Amen.

Practice for the Week

Set aside ten minutes each day for prayer with the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Closing Prayer

Sacred Heart of Jesus, help us place You at the center of each day. Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make our hearts like unto Thine. Amen.
