# ORDINARY TIME

Due to the solemnities of the Most Holy Trinity and Corpus Christi, as well as the celebration of the parish picnic, it has not been possible for us to take a moment to reflect on the Ordinary Time that began following Pentecost Sunday. Therefore—now returning to this intention—let us consider a few points regarding this liturgical season. At first glance, Ordinary Time may appear to be a "less special" period compared to the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, or Easter. However, this season possesses a profound significance and a beauty that invites us to live out our faith in a concrete, day-to-day manner. It is called "Ordinary" not because it is of lesser importance, but because it is structured into numbered weeks, guided by the "ordinariness" of the Sundays. During this season, the liturgical color is green, symbolizing hope and growth. Ordinary Time is a time to meditate on the public life of Jesus—his teachings, miracles, and encounters with people. The Sundays following Pentecost remind us of the historical life of Jesus, particularly his public ministry. These long weeks—and above all their corresponding Sundays—celebrate the entire mystery of Christ, from his Incarnation to his definitive coming at the end of time. It is not a season of boring routine, but rather a sequence marked by ordinal numbers. This is what is meant by the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time, the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time, and so on. Curiously, there is no "First Sunday of Ordinary Time," as it is replaced by the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. The \*Roman Missal, Third Edition\* instructs that Ordinary Time "begins on the Monday following the Sunday after January 6th and continues until the beginning of Lent; it begins again on the Monday following Pentecost Sunday and ends on the Saturday before the First Sunday of Advent." Before the liturgical reforms of the Second Vatican Council, these periods of Ordinary Time were referred to as "the time after Epiphany" and "the time after Pentecost." Although Ordinary Time unfolds in two parts, it is still considered a single season. The richness of Ordinary Time lies in the opportunity to know Christ more intimately amidst the everyday realities of life. The Scriptures proclaimed during Ordinary Time reveal Christ's teaching, healing, and mission, enabling us to better understand the God who became human. We learn that Christ is humility rather than pride, vulnerability rather than power. We learn that Christ includes the excluded, eats with the socially and religiously marginalized, and dismantles structures of sin and injustice. We learn that Christ is love—a self-sacrificing love that is possible only through an

authentic relationship. These are the days in which we become who we are called to be by imitating the reality lived by Jesus. Ordinary Time invites us to integrate faith into our daily lives—into the "ordinary" fabric of our days. This season reminds us that holiness is not lived out solely during great moments of celebration, but also through small, everyday actions: within the family, at work, in our studies, and in service to others. Ordinary Time is an invitation to walk with Jesus in the "day-to-day" reality of our lives, growing in faith, hope, and love. Far from being a time of "no importance," it is a period of continuous grace in which we can transform our daily actions into extraordinary moments of encounter with God. During Ordinary Time, we can recognize Christ and his experiences as he constantly sought to fulfill the will of the Father; we witness Christ's growth—both as a man and spiritually—as he lived within a community. Likewise, we must strive to mature and grow in our faith, in imitation of our Lord Jesus, as we strive to fulfill the most holy will of God. Throughout this time, the Church offers us the essentials for glorifying God and attaining our sanctification; it invites us to walk within the ordinary normalcy of the Christian life, nourishing and guiding us with the substantial means to remain steadfast in faith, grow in hope, and bear fruit in charity. Yet not everything ends within the church; it is essential that what is celebrated and lived out in the Eucharist propels us toward mission—toward bearing witness, toward apostolate, toward welcoming those in need, and toward embodying in our own lives what Christ has done for us. For this reason, Ordinary Time helps us to live out the mystery of Christ in its fullness; it helps us to deepen our understanding of—and grow in—what we have celebrated during Christmas, Easter, and the Easter Season; it highlights the primacy and vital importance of the "Lord's Day"; it offers us, in abundance, the opportunity to listen to and encounter the Word of God; and it teaches us to value the importance of the ordinary—lived to the fullest—viewing ordinary life as the saving space that God offers us for our sanctification.

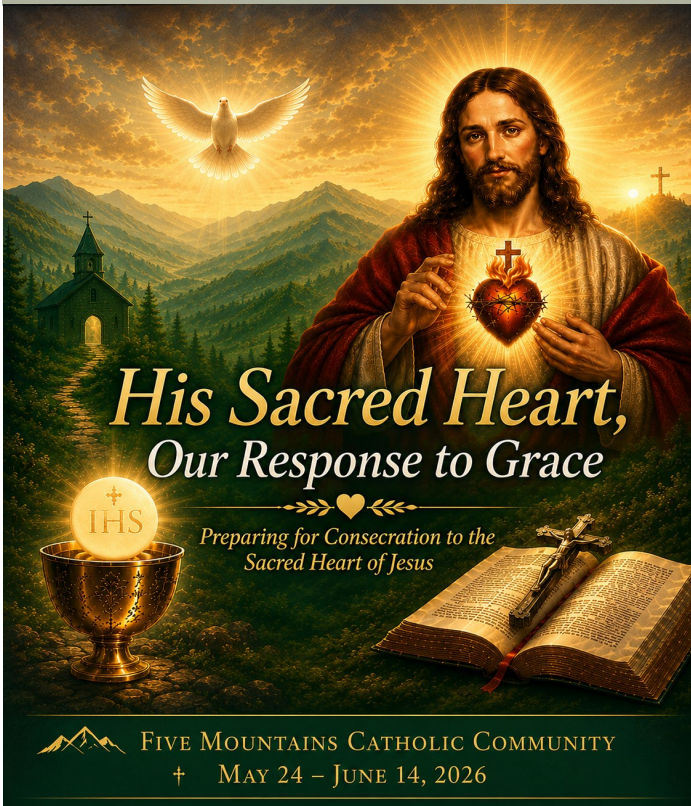

**“One Family in Christ”**  
**“Living the Consecration”**

**Remaining in the Sacred Heart of Jesus**

*“Abide in me, as I abide in you.” — John 15:4*

Over the past several weeks, our Five Mountains Catholic Community has journeyed together through the 33 Days Preparing for Consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Through prayer, reflection, and the Works of Mercy, we prepared our hearts and entrusted ourselves more fully to Christ.

Last weekend, we prayed the Act of Consecration:

"O Sacred Heart of Jesus, to Thee I consecrate and offer up my person and my life, my actions, trials, and sufferings..."

These words express our desire to belong completely to Jesus and to allow His love to guide every aspect of our lives.

#### **Reflection**

Consecration is not the end of our journey, it is the beginning.

Throughout the 33-day preparation, we were invited to know ourselves more deeply, grow in our understanding of the Sacred Heart, and enter into closer union with Christ. Now we are called to live what we have prayed.

Through St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, Jesus revealed His desire to pour abundant graces upon those who trust in His Sacred Heart. His promises remind us that He is our refuge, our peace, our comfort, and our source of mercy.

The Sacred Heart that was pierced on the Cross remains open to us today. In moments of joy and sorrow, strength and weakness, we can always return to Him with confidence and trust.

#### **Ponder**

- How is Jesus inviting me to live my consecration each day?
- Which Work of Mercy will I continue to practice?
- How can I remain close to the Sacred Heart throughout the year?

#### **Guided Prayer**

Sacred Heart of Jesus,  
I place my trust in Thee.

Help me remain faithful to the consecration I have made.  
May Your love guide my thoughts,  
Your mercy shape my actions,  
and Your peace dwell within my heart.  
Amen.

#### **Living the Consecration**

The Church encourages us to remain close to the Sacred Heart through:

- Frequent reception of the Eucharist
- Regular Confession
- Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament
- Acts of charity, mercy, and reparation

Through these simple practices, our hearts gradually become more like His, patient, merciful, and filled with love.

#### **Ongoing Practice**

Continue to find new ways in living your consecration:

- Spend time in Eucharistic Adoration.
- Pray the Litany of the Sacred Heart.
- Perform a Corporal or Spiritual Work of Mercy.
- Pray daily: “Sacred Heart of Jesus, I place my trust in Thee.”

#### **Closing Prayer**

Sacred Heart of Jesus,  
make our hearts like unto Thine.

May this consecration lead us to live each day in deeper trust, faithful love, and joyful service.

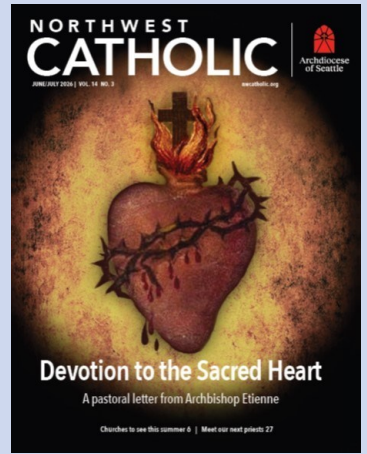
