LETTER OF GRATITUDE

Dear Parish Family,
Three years have passed since the Lord, in His infinite providence, entrusted me with the beautiful yet challenging task of walking among you as your brother, servant, and pastor. Three years that may seem like a mere breath, but which have been a true school of love and self-giving. Having held the responsibility of guiding you pastorally and spiritually in the name of Jesus Christ has been, without a doubt, one of the greatest blessings of my priestly life. I say this with humility: it was not I who guided you, but the Holy Spirit who—working through my limitations—sought to make His presence known. Under the patronage and watchful gaze of our beloved Saint John the Evangelist—the Beloved Disciple—we have endeavored to learn that the key to every ministry, and indeed to every Christian life, is precisely this: to abide in Love. John taught us to rest our heads upon the Master's chest to listen to the beating of His heart; it is my hope that, during this time, we have succeeded together in attuning our own hearts to the Heart of Christ. I wish to pause here to highlight the overflowing generosity of this community. I have witnessed how you have given not only your material resources for the support of our ministries and the church building, but something far more valuable: your time and your very lives. The selfless service of all the ministries—from the acolytes to those who reach out to the needy—is, in truth, the living face of a Church that does not look inward but rather goes forth to encounter others. This dedication of yours has been the "fuel" for my own ministry. Seeing your active faith and your readiness to make sacrifices has expanded my heart as both a father and a pastor. I depart with my hands full of testimonies of everyday holiness—testimonies that, I am certain, will greatly enrich my future priestly service. You have taught me how to be a better priest; you have taught me that the priesthood only finds its true meaning when it is spent in the service of one's brothers and sisters. Now, a new chapter begins. In the dynamic of the Kingdom of God, the laborers come and go, but the Master of the harvest

remains. Soon, your next parish priest will arrive among you. I ask of you—with the same affection with which I always speak to you—that you receive him with open arms and a spirit of fraternal welcome. He comes in the name of the Lord to continue the work that we have cultivated together. Offer him your support, your patience, and that same generosity you bestowed upon me. A community that knows how to welcome its pastor is a community that flourishes in charity. Finally, I wish to tell you with total conviction: this is not a goodbye. In the Church, we—the children of God—never part ways forever. We will continue walking together. Perhaps my feet will tread other streets, and my hands will bless other communities, but we will remain united in that ineffable mystery which is the Mystical Body of Christ. Through Baptism, we form a single unity that knows no distance. Whenever we approach the altar—at every Eucharist—we will meet again in the Communion of Saints. Thank you for allowing me to be part of your history. Thank you for being my family. May the intercession of Saint John the Evangelist keep you always faithful to the Word, and may the blessing of Almighty God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—descend upon you, your homes, your work, and your paths, and remain with you always.

I receive this new pastoral mission with humility, hope, and a deep spirit of service, trusting fully in the will of God, who always guides His Church through paths of grace and blessing.

First of all, I would like to express my sincere gratitude to the Lord for allowing me to continue my priestly ministry among this beloved community of faith. Every parish, every family, and every person reflects the living face of Christ in our world. For this reason, I come with the desire to listen, accompany, serve, and walk together with you as your pastor and brother in faith.

I also wish to extend a warm and fraternal greeting to my brother priests who will be collaborating with me in this new pastoral journey. I deeply appreciate their generous dedication to the Gospel and the loving care they provide to the People of God. Together, I believe we will continue strengthening our parish communities and building a Church that is alive, welcoming, and filled with hope.

Allow me to briefly share part of my personal and priestly journey.

My name is Father José M. Álvarez. I was born on March 3, 1981, in Mexico. I completed my elementary education in the state of Michoacán. Later, I attended high school at Instituto Cultural Sucre in Ciudad Satélite, State of Mexico, and continued my formation at the Minor Seminary of the Archdiocese of Tlalneantla.

I studied philosophy at the Seminario Conciliar de México and later pursued theological studies at Saint Patrick's Seminary in Menlo Park, California, where I earned a Master of Divinity degree.

I was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Seattle on June 9, 2012. Since then, the Lord has blessed me with the opportunity to serve in different parish communities throughout our archdiocese. I served as parochial vicar at Saint Frances Cabrini and Saint John Bosco Parishes (2012-2013), as parochial vicar in Mount Vernon and Sedro-Woolley (2013-2014), as priest administrator in Lynden and Deming (2014-2017), and later as pastor of Holy Family Parish in Seattle from 2017 to 2026.

In addition, I have served as chaplain at John F. Kennedy Catholic High School, member of the board of Catholic Community Services, and Dean of South Seattle.

Today, I come to this Family of Parishes with a sincere desire to serve, love, and accompany the People of God. I firmly believe that the Church is built by walking together, listening to one another, and always keeping our eyes fixed on Christ.

My hope is that together we may continue building the Kingdom of God through paths of unity, faith, and hope. I come not only as a priest and pastor, but also as a brother in faith, ready to share in the joys, challenges, and hopes of our communities.

I humbly ask for your prayers, that the Lord may grant me the grace to be a shepherd after the heart of Christ: close to the people, humble, and filled with love for God's people.

Be assured that I already carry all of you in my prayers, and I entrust each of your families and communities to the loving protection of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

May the Lord allow us to begin this new pastoral journey together with renewed faith, a spirit of unity, and great hope.

STEWARDSHIP SERIES – WEEK 1 “Take, Lord, Receive” Everything Is Gift

*“What do you possess that you have not received?”
— 1 Corinthians 4:7*

Just a few weeks ago, our Five Mountains Catholic Community completed a journey of preparation and consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Through prayer and reflection, we entrusted ourselves more fully to the Heart that loves us without measure.

Consecration is not simply a prayer we recite, it is a way of living. When we consecrate ourselves to the Sacred Heart, we acknowledge that our lives belong to Christ and that everything we are and everything we possess comes from Him.

This truth lies at the heart of Christian stewardship.

Stewardship begins not with giving, but with gratitude. Before we can offer anything back to God, we must first recognize that all is gift.

The Heart That Gives Everything

“For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son.”— John 3:16

The Sacred Heart of Jesus reveals a God who holds nothing back. Throughout His earthly life, Jesus poured Himself out in love, teaching, healing, forgiving, and serving. On the Cross, His Heart was pierced for our salvation, becoming the visible sign of God's mercy and love.

Even today, Christ continues to give Himself completely to us in the Eucharist.

The Sacred Heart teaches us that love is self-giving. Jesus offers Himself entirely, and as disciples, we are called to respond to that love.

Reflection

“Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above.”— James 1:17

The Sacred Heart of Jesus reveals a God who gives completely. Through His life, death, and resurrection, Christ pours Himself out in love for us. Even now, He continues to give Himself to us in the Eucharist.

Our response is gratitude.

St. Ignatius of Loyola expressed this beautifully in his prayer known as the Suscipe:

Take, Lord, and receive all that I have and possess. You have given all to me. To You, O Lord, I return it.

These words echo the spirit of our consecration to the Sacred Heart.

**I belong to Christ. Everything I have is a gift.
Everything I am is a gift.**

When we begin to see life this way, gratitude changes how we live. We become more aware of God's blessings and more willing to share our time, talents, and resources in service to Him and others. Stewardship is not motivated by obligation; it is a response to love.

Ponder

Do I recognize my life as a gift from God?
What blessings am I most grateful for today?
How is God inviting me to use His gifts for His glory?

Guided Prayer

Sacred Heart of Jesus,

Teach me to recognize every gift as coming from You. Fill my heart with gratitude and help me offer my life back to You in love .Amen

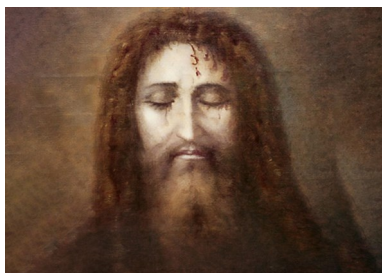
