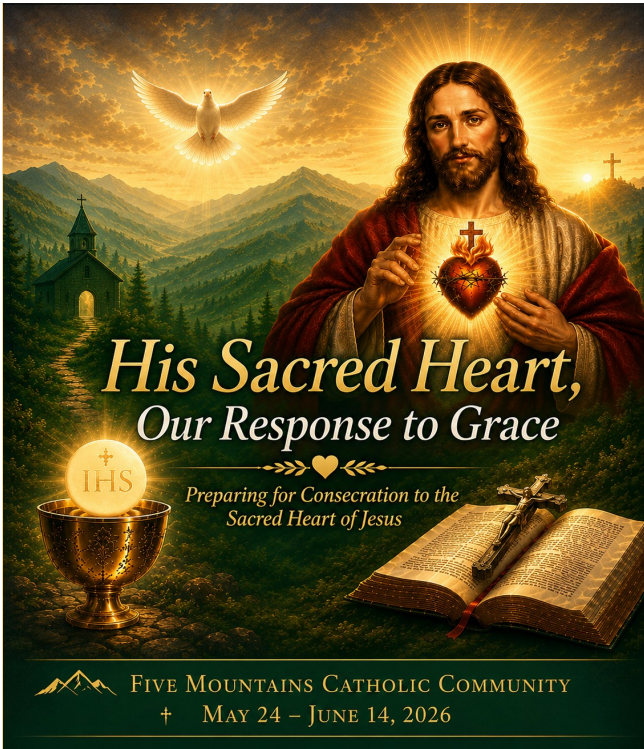

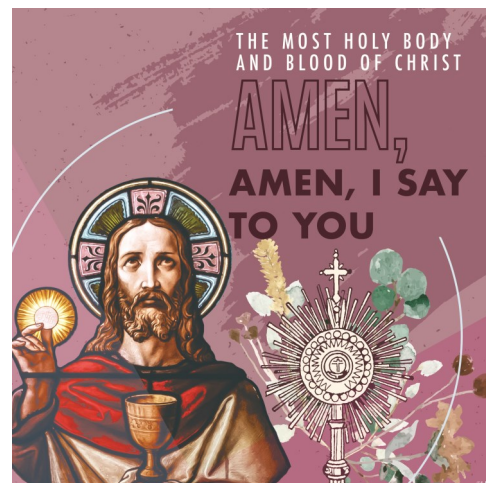


SOLEMNITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI

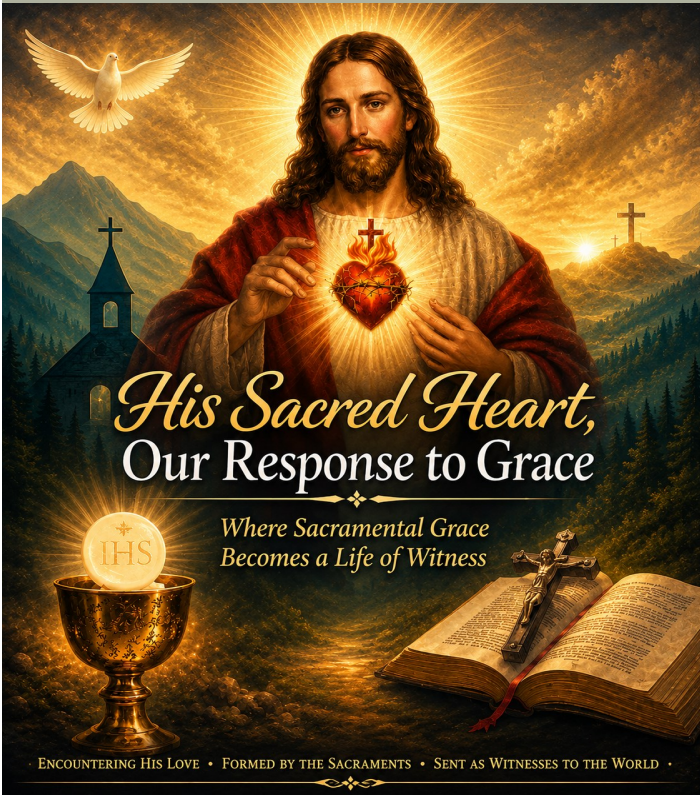
The Solemnity of Corpus Christi honors the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Christ is present in many ways within the Church, but His presence in the Eucharist is unique. It is called the "Real Presence" because Jesus is truly present 'par excellence'. The celebration of this feast began in Liège in 1246 and was extended to the entire Western Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264, with the aim of proclaiming faith in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist—a permanent and substantial presence that is worthy of adoration during solemn exposition and in processions with the Blessed Sacrament. This day serves as an occasion not only to believe and adore, but also to gain a deeper understanding of the richness of this mystery through the prayers and biblical texts assigned to the three cycles of readings. If Jesus Christ saved us on the Cross, then, in instituting the Eucharist, He desired to leave us within it a living memorial of His Passion. The altar serves as a prolongation of Calvary, and the Mass proclaims the death of the Lord. For, indeed, Jesus is present there as a victim; the words of the double consecration reveal to us that the bread is first transformed into the Body of Christ, and subsequently the wine into His Blood, such that He offers to His Father—in union with His priests—the blood that was shed and the body that was nailed to the Cross. Christians partake in His eternal life by uniting themselves to Jesus in the Sacrament—the most sublime, real, and concrete expression of unity with the Victim of Calvary. This anticipated possession of the divine life here on earth, through the medium of the Eucharist, serves as both a pledge and a beginning of that other life which we shall fully enjoy in Heaven; for "the very Bread of angels, which we now consume beneath sacred veils, we shall later contemplate in Heaven, unveiled" (Council of Trent). The Catechism of the Catholic Church, in paragraphs 1407 through 1419, speaks to us regarding the Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ: "The Eucharist is the heart and summit of the Church's life, for in it Christ associates His Church and all her members with His sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, offered once for all on the cross to His Father; through this sacrifice, He pours out the graces of salvation upon His Body, which is the Church. The Eucharistic celebration always comprises: the proclamation of the Word of God; thanksgiving to God the Father for all His benefits, above all for the gift of His Son; the consecration of the bread and wine; and participation in the liturgical banquet by receiving the Body and Blood of the Lord: these elements constitute one and the same act of worship. The Eucharist is the memorial of Christ's Passover—that is, of the work of salvation accomplished by the life, death, and resurrection of Christ—a work that is made present through the liturgical action." It is Christ himself, the eternal High Priest of the New Covenant, who, through the ministry of priests, offers the Eucharistic sacrifice. And it is also Christ himself—truly present under the species of bread and wine—who is the offering of the Eucharistic sacrifice. Only validly ordained priests may preside over the Eucharist and consecrate the

bread and wine so that they become the Body and Blood of the Lord. The essential signs of the Eucharistic sacrament are wheat bread and grape wine, upon which the blessing of the Holy Spirit is invoked and the priest pronounces the words of consecration spoken by Jesus at the Last Supper. Through the consecration, the transubstantiation of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is effected. Under the consecrated species of bread and wine, Christ himself—living and glorious—is present in a true, real, and substantial manner, with his Body, his Blood, his soul, and his divinity (Council of Trent: DS 1640; 1651). As a sacrifice, the Eucharist is also offered in reparation for the sins of the living and the deceased, and to obtain spiritual or temporal benefits from God. Anyone who wishes to receive Christ in Eucharistic Communion must be in a state of grace. If one is conscious of having committed a mortal sin, one must not approach the Eucharist without having first received absolution in the Sacrament of Penance. Holy Communion of the Body and Blood of Christ increases the communicant's union with the Lord, forgives venial sins, and preserves him from grave sins. Since the bonds of charity between the communicant and Christ are strengthened, the reception of this sacrament reinforces the unity of the Church, the Mystical Body of Christ. The Church strongly encourages the faithful to receive Holy Communion when participating in the celebration of the Eucharist and imposes upon them the obligation to do so at least once a year. Since Christ Himself is present in the Sacrament of the Altar, He must be honored with the worship of adoration. "A visit to the Blessed Sacrament is a proof of gratitude, a sign of love, and a duty of adoration toward Christ our Lord." Christ, who passed from this world to the Father, gives us in the Eucharist the pledge of the glory we shall share with Him: participation in the Holy Sacrifice identifies us with His Heart, sustains our strength throughout the pilgrimage of this life, makes us long for Eternal Life, and unites us—even now—to the Church in heaven, to the Blessed Virgin Mary, and to all the saints.

“Be Merciful, Just as Your Father Is Merciful” The Sacred Heart and the Corporal Works of Mercy

“Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.”
— Luke 6:36

Not all suffering can be seen.

Many people carry hidden wounds: grief, fear, anxiety, shame, confusion, bitterness, loneliness, or spiritual exhaustion. Jesus continually ministered not only to physical needs, but also to the human heart.

He forgave sinners.
He comforted the sorrowful.
He taught truth with patience.
He restored hope to the discouraged.

The Spiritual Works of Mercy call us to imitate this compassionate love.

In today’s world, mercy is urgently needed in our conversations, families, workplaces, and parish life. Words can wound deeply — but they can also heal.

To consecrate ourselves to the Sacred Heart means allowing Jesus to transform the way we speak, judge, forgive, and accompany others.

The Spiritual Works of Mercy remind us that holiness is not only about personal prayer; it is about helping others draw closer to God.

Reflection

One of the hardest forms of mercy is forgiveness.

The Sacred Heart of Jesus continually offers mercy to us, even when we fail, wander, or struggle. Christ asks us to extend that same mercy to others.

Forgiveness does not excuse wrongdoing, nor does it erase pain overnight. But forgiveness opens space for healing and freedom.

Another powerful work of mercy is simply listening with compassion.

In a noisy and divided world, patient listening can become a profound act of love.

The Spiritual Works of Mercy invite us to become people who:

- speak truth gently,
- encourage rather than condemn,
- pray faithfully for others,
- carry one another’s burdens,
- and lead others toward hope.

The Sacred Heart is a refuge for weary souls. Through mercy, we help others encounter that refuge.

Ponder

- Is there someone I need to forgive?
- Have my words reflected the compassion of Christ?
- How can I offer encouragement or hope to someone struggling spiritually or emotionally?
- Do I pray regularly for others, especially those who are suffering?

Guided Prayer

Sacred Heart of Jesus,
source of mercy and compassion,
heal the hardness within my heart.
Teach me to forgive as You forgive.
Help me speak words that heal rather than wound.
Give me patience with others and humility within myself.
May I become a source of encouragement, peace, and hope.
Use me to bring others closer to Your Sacred Heart.
Amen.

Practice for the Week

Choose one Spiritual Work of Mercy to practice intentionally:

- Pray daily for someone who is struggling.
- Reconcile with someone after conflict.
- Encourage a person carrying grief or stress.
- Offer patient listening instead of quick judgment.
- Share faith gently with someone seeking hope.

Allow your words and actions to become channels of Christ’s mercy.
