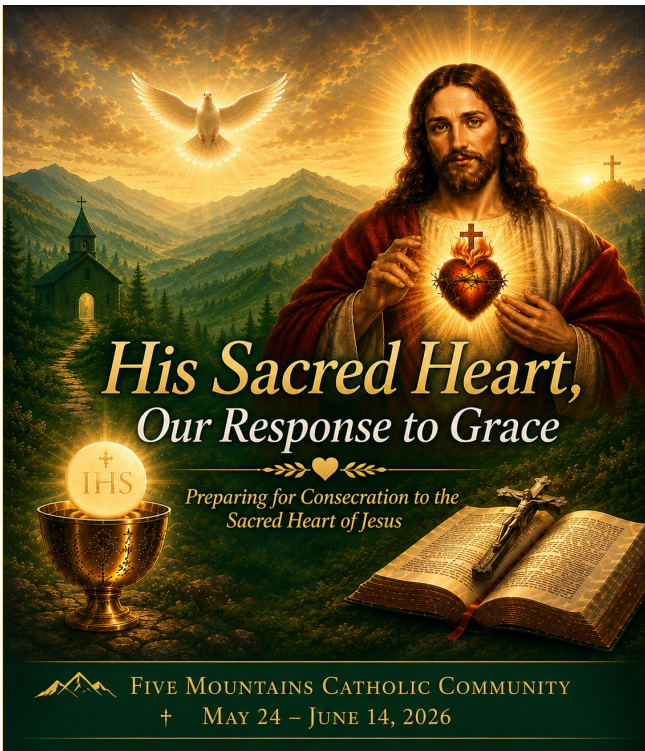

PASTOR'S LETTER



SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

A decade ago, Pope Francis, addressing a group of children preparing for their First Communion, offered a simple yet beautiful explanation of what the Most Holy Trinity is. The Pope said: "The Father creates the world; Jesus saves us; and what does the Holy Spirit do? He loves us; He gives us love." With this brief formula, Pope Francis shed light on the greatest mystery of our faith—not only for those children at the time, but for all the faithful. In the face of God—that is to say, in the presence of the sacred—there will always be things we cannot explain, things we cannot understand, and questions that will arise again and again without ever finding a definitive answer. It is natural for a certain bewilderment to ensue—even an initial sense of discouragement—yet these are to be fully overcome when contemplating, in loving prayer, the mystery of the Trinity. Let us not forget that God is precisely that: a "mystery." Saint Joan of Arc had already warned: "God is so great that He surpasses our knowledge." And thus, out of love, He has revealed Himself to mankind to invite them to participate in His own life. The Catechism of the Catholic Church, in paragraph 234, tells us: "The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in Himself. It is, therefore, the source of all the other mysteries of the faith; it is the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the 'hierarchy of the truths of faith.' The whole history of salvation is nothing other than the history of the way and the means by which the one true God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—reveals Himself, reconciles to Himself the men who were estranged by sin, and unites Himself with them"; and in paragraph 249, it makes known to us: The revealed truth of the Holy Trinity has been, from the very origins, at the root of the Church's living faith, principally in the act of baptism. It finds its expression in the rule of baptismal faith, formulated in the preaching, catechesis, and prayer of the Church. These formulations are already found in the apostolic writings, such as this greeting preserved in the Eucharistic liturgy: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God the Father, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with all of you" (2 Cor 13:13). The entire life of the Church derives from the central belief that there is one true God in three divine persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. From the beginning of time, God has gradually revealed and communicated the truth of who the Most Holy Trinity is through what He has done in the history of salvation. Although

God gradually revealed Himself through different stages of the Old Testament period of salvation history, humanity had no way of knowing the full truth regarding the inner life of the Triune God prior to the time of Christ, since this mystery of our faith is "inaccessible to human reason alone... before the Incarnation of the Son of God and the sending of the Holy Spirit." In his encyclical **Spe Salvi**, Pope Benedict XVI poses a challenging question: "So now we must ask explicitly: Is the Christian faith—for us today as well—a hope that changes and sustains life... one that shapes our lives in a new way, or is it merely 'information' that leaves us unchanged? Furthermore, what difference does this central mystery of our faith make in our daily lives? By revealing Himself as Trinitarian, God has not merely shared impersonal facts about Himself; rather, God has shared Himself with us, inviting us into His own inner life and into that communion of love which constitutes the origin, the goal, and the meaning of our lives. Although the word 'Trinity' does not appear as such in Sacred Scripture, the Church defined the term as describing the truth regarding the God revealed in the Scriptures: One God in Three Divine Persons. Many other terms, for example, Incarnation, Person, and Sacrament—have been employed throughout the centuries to teach revealed truths, acquiring stable meanings through consistent usage or by the authoritative decision of the Church. The distinction between the Persons can be demonstrated, for instance, by the fact that Jesus speaks to His Father. This would make no sense if they were one and the same person (Mt 11:25–27)." The fact that Jesus is not the same person as the Holy Spirit is revealed when Jesus—who has been functioning as the disciples' Paraclete—says that He will pray to the Father and the Father will give them "another Paraclete," who is the Holy Spirit. This demonstrates the distinction of the three Persons: Jesus, who prays; the Father, who sends; and the Spirit, who comes (Jn 14:16–17). God has left traces of His Trinitarian being in creation and in the Old Testament; however, the intimacy of His being as the Holy Trinity constitutes a mystery inaccessible to human reason alone—and even to the faith of Israel—prior to the Incarnation of the Son of God and the sending of the Holy Spirit. This mystery has been revealed by Jesus Christ, and it is the source of all other mysteries.

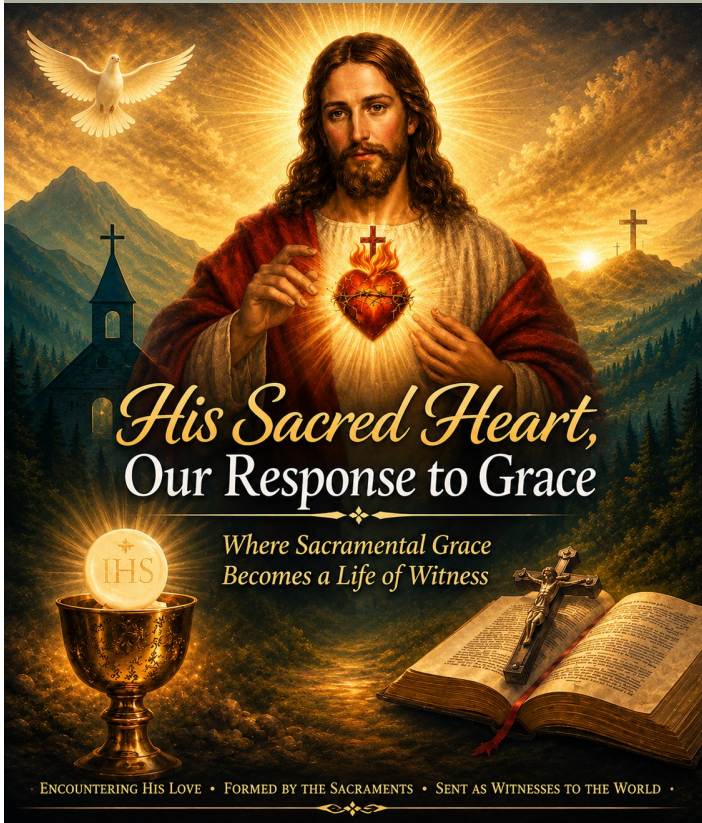

“I Was Hungry and You Gave Me Food” The Sacred Heart and the Corporal Works of Mercy

***“Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these
least brothers of mine, you did for me.”
— Matthew 25:40***

The Sacred Heart of Jesus is a Heart moved with compassion for human suffering. Throughout the Gospels, Jesus notices those whom others overlook: the hungry crowds, the sick, the grieving, the poor, and the abandoned.

Jesus never treated people as interruptions. He encountered each person with dignity and love.

The Corporal Works of Mercy invite us to do the same.

When we feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, shelter the homeless, or visit the sick, we encounter Christ Himself. Mercy is not simply charity; it is relationship. It is recognizing the face of Jesus in another person.

As our Five Mountains Catholic Community prepares for Consecration to the Sacred Heart, we are invited to become a parish family known not only for worship, but for compassionate action.

The Sacred Heart is not closed. It is open, wounded, and poured out for others.

Reflection

Sometimes mercy begins with simple awareness. We may not always see the hidden suffering around us:

- the elderly person longing for conversation,
- the family struggling financially,
- the grieving widow,
- the exhausted caregiver,
- the neighbor quietly carrying anxiety or loneliness.

The Heart of Jesus notices every person.

The Corporal Works of Mercy remind us that holiness is deeply practical. Love is lived through concrete actions, not merely good intentions.

Small acts matter greatly in the Kingdom of God.

- A meal shared.
- A ride offered.
- A hospital visit.
- A listening ear.
- A note of encouragement.

(When done with love, these become sacred acts flowing from the Heart of Christ.)

Ponder

- Who around me may be carrying burdens I cannot see?
- How can I become more attentive to those in need?
- Do I see mercy as an inconvenience or as an opportunity to encounter Jesus?
- How is our parish community called to reflect the compassion of the Sacred Heart?

Guided Prayer

Sacred Heart of Jesus,
You never turned away those who came to You in need.
Give me eyes that notice suffering,
a heart that responds with compassion,
and hands willing to serve generously.
Remove indifference from my heart.
Teach me to recognize You in the poor, the sick, the lonely,
and the forgotten.
May every act of mercy draw me closer to Your Sacred Heart.
Amen.

Practice for the Week

Choose one concrete act of corporal mercy this week:

- Deliver food to someone in need.
- Visit or call someone who is homebound.
- Donate clothing or household items.
- Offer practical help to a struggling family.
- Spend intentional time with someone who is lonely.

Before each act, quietly pray:
“Sacred Heart of Jesus, love through me.”

Heart of Jesus, Fountain of Life and Holiness,
fill our hearts with mercy and love.
Jesus, meek and humble of heart,
make our hearts like unto Thine.
Amen.

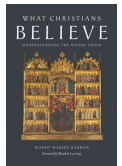

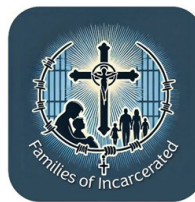
