**H**ERE is a splendid opportunity for young girls to fit themselves for their part in the National Emergency when every effort is necessary towards winning the War and the subsequent Peace. Any girl over 14 years can join: it is absolutely voluntary—you can leave again if you so wish.

The Lectures and Parades are held usually in the evenings and at week-ends and do not interfere with your normal activities.

You will not be asked for any contribution except, perhaps, a small subscription to your Unit.

#### **ANTI-AIRCRAFT OPERATIONAL DUTIES AND RADIOLOCATION,**

requiring knowledge of School certificate mathematics; use of decimals; quick mental addition and division; use of bearings in degrees; elementary electricity and magnetism; taking messages; aircraft recognition, British and enemy; map reading.

#### **A FEW OF THE COURSES OF TRAINING**

#### **SIGNALS**

requiring knowledge of Morse code; reading and sending in Morse; taking messages; touch typewriting.

#### **MOTOR DRIVERS**

Theory of the motor engine; elementary maintenance of motor vehicles; map reading; highway code.

The question of uniform is quite simple. When you first join, you wear any plain skirt and ordinary blouse or jumper of your own.

Later on you may wish to have the complete uniform, consisting of a grey skirt and Air Force blue blouse and tie and grey forage cap. Your Unit Commander will explain how these can be obtained.

All N.C.O.'s are appointed from among the girls.

The training is not monotonous ; it is varied so that the Lectures are inter-mixed with the lighter training.

### PRE-ENTRY SERVICE TRAINING

The Women's Junior Air Corps will give you full details of the various subjects you must study in order to enter one of the specialist branches of the Senior Services ; and once you have made your selection you will be required to attend practical lectures under qualified instructors.

### CLERICAL AND OFFICE DUTIES

General clerks ; shorthand typists ; typists ; draughts-women ; comptometer operators. Instruction in spelling ; filing ; writing ; typing ; shorthand ; office routine.

### ENGINEERING AND ELECTRICAL WORK—

Handling of tools ; materials used in various jobs ; types of machinery used ; workshop safety precautions ; theory of wireless ; elementary electricity.

You will find the W.J.A.C. is just what you have been waiting for — training, companionship and national service.

The Corps urgently needs Officers and Lady or Gentleman Instructors for the various specialists lectures. You will be doing a paramount national service in coming forward to train the country's eager young women.
