1. Washing Your Car

5. Maintain Hydrophobic Properties

- Why: Over time, contaminants like road grime or bird droppings can weaken the hydrophobic effect.
- Solution:
 - Use a ceramic boost spray every 3–6 months to restore slickness and water beading.
 - Follow your installer's advice for product recommendations.

6. Address Contaminants Immediately

- What to Watch For:
 - 1. Bird droppings
 - 2. Tree sap
 - 3. Bug splatter
- Steps:
 - 1. Gently remove contaminants with water and a microfiber cloth as soon as possible.
 - 2. Avoid letting contaminants sit—they can break down the coating over time.

7. Avoid Harsh Chemicals and Abrasive Tools

- Don'ts:
 - Avoid products containing abrasives, acids, or degreasers.
 - Never use rough sponges or brushes.

8. Schedule Annual Inspections

- Why It Matters: Annual inspections ensure your ceramic coating is performing as expected.
- What to Expect:
 - A professional check for weak spots or contaminants that need to be addressed.
 - Reapplication of booster products, if needed.
