

Pharmacist, botanist, plant physiologist and geneticist. Wilhelm Johannsen Center for Functional Genome Research is located in Copenhagen. Johannsen's *Elements of Heredity* (1909) became an influential text, and his terms *phenotype* and *genotype* are now a part of the language of genetics.

Christmas Eve is celebrated on December 24. A traditional dinner includes risengrod, turkey, browned potatos, red cabbage, herring and aeblekage.

Activity:

- 1. Have each member bring in a Danish Christmas decoration (or two) from home and talk about the sentiments they hold for you.
- 2. Create red and white checkered heart baskets and paper cornicopias to hang on the tree.
- 3. Make and share glogg. Then sing Christmas songs together.
- 4. Talk about the Danish Christmas traditions your family observes.
