RESOLUTION—Lillie Iversen Miller, 1st National Sisterhood Lifetime Achievement Award Recipient

Lillie (Lil) Iversen Miller passed away peacefully on October 24, 2025 at the age of 98. To say her heritage and the Danish Sisterhood was her passion would be an understatement. Lil was so dedicated to the Danish Sisterhood, serving in nearly every capacity both locally in Petaluma and with the California District. Lil was also honored with the very first National Sisterhood Lifetime Achievement Award, an honor she always treasured.

Born into a family with deep ties to the community and to its Danish heritage, Lillie and her younger sister, Nancy, were the daughters of Iven and Asta Iversen, who moved to Skillman Lane in 1926 where they rented George Christie's egg ranch before purchasing the 8.5 acre property in 1929.

Operating an egg ranch that produced thousands of eggs every day was no easy job, but with two hard working and appreciative daughters who inherited their father's determined work ethic, the endless list of tasks was vigorously accomplished. Feeding the chickens, cleaning eggs before and after school, and sweeping out the hen houses became routine work. And when it was completed, the girls went to the Saturday movies at the California Theater.

Lil would say they worked hard, just like the boys, it was necessary. Lil was a confident student, whose work ethic never diminished, Lil took math classes at Petaluma High School, where she graduated mid-term in 1946 and started a new job two days later earning \$1.27 an hour in the payroll department of the Poultry Producers.

Walt Miller and Lil were married in 1949 and lived on the Iversen property while he worked as a carpenter for Hugh Codding and later at Lace House Linen. Lillie worked at the Poultry Producers until the birth of her daughter, Jan, in 1952 and a second daughter, Joyce, was born in 1966. Lil returned to work in 1970, as a bookkeeper for a local orthopedic surgeon, Dr. Jerome Beatie. When Dr. Beatie retired, she continued working half-a-day for Dr. Lance Barlas, before

retiring at the age of 89, only because he retired too.

Lil was very active in both the Elim Lutheran Church, which she joined in 1933, and with the Danish Sisterhood. Enjoying the financial side of things, she counted the Sunday collection plates at the church for many years and offered her time at events like the "Make it, Bake it, Grow it, Sew it" auction, and the annual æbleskive breakfast. Lil's grandparents, Christian and Karen Iversen, were charter members of Danish Brotherhood Lodge #143, established in 1901, and Danish Sisterhood Lodge #126, established in 1911. A lifetime lodge member, Lillie served as treasurer of the Petaluma Sisterhood for 50+ years.

When not planning or working on Sisterhood events, Lil loved family time most, gardening, puzzles and word search games. Lil was the matriarch of the Petaluma Danish Sisterhood #126 and will be deeply missed by family, friends and those that feel like family (she had a way of making you feel special).

45TH ANNUAL SCANDINAVIAN DAY FESTIVAL

At Vasa Park on Sunday, September 7th, the Scandinavian community gathered for the 45th Annual Festival presented by Scandinavian Park, Inc., NFP in South Elgin, IL (www.vasaparkil.com). The festival is dedicated to the preservation and celebration of the five Nordic countries: Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway and Sweden.

My spouse and I worked in the Danish Sisterhood of America Dagmar Lodge #4 booth in the morning—making, selling and eating æbleskiver with strawberry jam, rhubarb pudding with cream, and \$1 coffees. After our busy shift changed over, we were ready to eat again so we headed to Sweden's Viljan Lodge #349 booth to lunch on Swedish meatballs before watching the ceremonies begin around noon. All five countries had their Consuls in attendance and they were introduced as each country's National Anthems were sung and played. Such a treat!

During our next volunteer shift, this time at the Danish Sisterhood booth, I enjoyed chatting with many people under the Danish tent we shared with the DAAC (Danish American Athletic Club), The Danish Pioneer newspaper, Rebild National Park Society, Dania Society of Chicago, and the Danish Home in Chicago. Several ladies I talked with expressed interest in joining the Sisterhood. My husband, Paul, enjoyed talking with the Danish men, some being Mr. Sisters in our Dagmar Lodge.

Shopping at the various booths while enjoying the different dance groups (Nordic Folk Dancers of Chicago, Leikarringen Heimhug Dancers) and musical artists (Danish songwriter Anita Lerche, Libido Funk Circus) closed out our time enjoying the festival. Before leaving, we had a snack: The Nimbus Club's Danish hotdogs. My only regret was missing the church service in the morning and the closing bonfire in the evening. I'm hoping next year to enjoy the whole festival with family and friends who can enjoy the face painting, pony rides and time together.



LEARN ABOUT WESTERN STAR LODGE #113, GRAND ISLAND, NEBRASKA

Western Star Lodge #113 includes several members from Dannebrog, Nebraska. Dannebrog, which means "Danish flag", is in central Nebraska and is the Danish Capital. Tim Hannibal's great-great-great-grandfather founded Dannebrog in 1871. Hannibal is a member of our lodge.

Dannebrog has some interesting shops in the downtown area. Hannibal is the owner of a unique ice cream cafe. Dannebrog Delights is a wonderlicious ice cream cafe with board games, arts and crafts, and puzzles. It has a cozy atmosphere for customers to enjoy their treats. Edie Grim, another member of our lodge, has a quaint shop named "Bedstemor's". She has many antiques and other miscellaneous items and has a collection of Bing & Grondahl and Royal Copenhagen Blue plates dating back to the 1960s. She also sells Danish licorice which is from the Licorice International store in Lincoln, Nebraska. Another shop in this Danish town is the Danish Bakery. The bakery is dedicated to crafting exceptional, high-quality bread and baked goods that celebrate the art of traditional baking. The Treasure Trove, which is a shop located where the old Pawnee Indian Court was years ago and is owned by Roger Welsch, sells artisan items. They have over forty vendors with homemade items such as rugs, knives, pottery and paintings.

Columbia Hall, which sits in the hub of town, was built in 1908 by the Danish Brotherhood. A complete renovation of the hall was started in 1991. It now serves as a community hall and museum. The Danish Sisterhood was established in 1909 and used the hall until they disbanded in the late 1940s.

Within the last few years, several Amish families have moved into the area and have contributed to the community.

Members of Western star Lodge #113 include Diana Honore, Sylvia McTavish, Edie Grim, Tim Hannibal, Leila Johnson, Jackie Gawrych, Carolyn Andersen, Christine Rindone, Vicki Vig and Lois Baasch. The husband of Diana Honore, the member who has belonged in our lodge the longest and is our President, was born in Denmark. They have made nine trips to Denmark to see family. Lois Baasch's husband was also born in Denmark. Sylvia McTavish, our Vice President, celebrated her 94th birthday in the hospital after breaking her hip. She says she's doing fine, is 100% Danish and is one tough Dane.

We are a small group but we enjoy meeting together nine months of the year. We have learned to speak Danish phrases such as "jeg elsker dig", which means I love you. We are also learning our numbers from 1-10 in Danish. We all treasure our Danish heritage.







MEET YOUR 2026 DENMARK TOUR DIRECTOR

Even though I have known about the Danish Sisterhood of America for decades, I have never really had an opportunity or reason to get too acquainted with this worthy organization that is represented across the continent. I have now, especially after I was asked to become the tour director for DSS's bi-annual trip to Denmark: This occurred after Benedikte Ehlers (previous Tour Director) and I had some valuable conversations. I was glad I accepted the task which expanded my network both in the USA and in Denmark, but also gave me an opportunity to connect with 32 great Danes and Danish-Americans, who had signed up for the tour to East Jutland and Copenhagen.

In 2026, the tour will go to The Wild and Wonderful North Jutland and a post tour to Roskilde and Copenhagen. You can read about this elsewhere. As an educator by trade and a semi-pro team handball coach, especially in Frederikshavn, I have over the years arranged numerous trips abroad and chaperoned just as many. Handball brought me to Norway and Germany, language tour programs arranged by Tjœreborg Studio gave me great trips to England, The Channel Islands and the US (Allentown/Bethlehem and Quincy/Boston). Often, from 2000 to 2020, I was the tour organizer for the National Danish Performance Team in Canada and the Eastern and Southern US. In addition, I have facilitated many trips across the Atlantic, both ways, for dancers, musicians, gymnasts, students and educators via The Danish Gymnastics and Sports Association, Berea College and The Folk Circle Association of Berea, Aalborg Business College and others.

After high school, I spent a year at Aarhus Sports Academy (idrœtshøjskole) and spent another year traveling in the Middle East, Europe, Latin and North America, which probably created some additional survivor skills and critical thinking. I graduated from Hjørring with a teaching degree, from Aalborg University with a "korrespondent" degree and did graduate work there as well with a focus on International relations. While teaching at a business college (16 to 20-year olds), I earned two degrees from The Educational Institute of Denmark for Vocational Studies in Copenhagen (Danmarks Erhvervspædagogiske Læreruddannelse). I created a tourism program, which later on was used for women, who needed a second or third chance to return to the labor market.

In 1997, I gave up my tenured position at Aalborg Business College and moved to Berea, Kentucky, because I had married a Kentuckian, Barbara (educator of French, Spanish and English). The next many years, I found myself teaching for some time, worked as a realtor (Berkshire Hathaway), bought a café with twenty-eight employees and ran it for almost ten years. In 2002, I created Dantucky Properties LLC, which I still have some fun with.

My engagement in the local community has always been important and extensive, and I can look back at many activities and creations that made a difference in many people's lives. In addition, my involvement with Rebild National Park Society, Danish American Heritage Society and Madison County International Committee has been extensive. I also serve on my church's endowment committee.


