Greetings, Sisters:







ON THE COVER—A Lego pumpkin and a Dracula mascot for Halloween in the amusement park Legoland Billund Resort in Denmark. Legoland Billund Resort, the original Legoland park, opened on June 7, 1968, in Billund, Denmark. It is located next to the original Lego factory and Billund Airport, Denmark's second-busiest airport.

The park has been a significant tourist attraction in Denmark, with over 1.9 million guests visiting in 2011 and 50 million guests since its opening. The park is divided into nine themed areas, including Duplo Land, Imagination Zone, LEGOREDO Town, Adventure Land, Lego City, Knight's Kingdom, Miniland, Pirate Land, and Polar Land. LEGOLAND® Billund is the most visited tourist attraction in Jutland and the third-most visited attraction in Denmark, after Tivoli Gardens and Dyrehavsbakken.

Some history of Lego: In 1932, a Billund carpenter named Ole Kirk Christiansen turned his tools to making wooden toys and came up with the name Lego, a contraction of *leg godt*, meaning "play well." His original concept got transposed to the famous interlocking plastic bricks, launched in 1958, and by some estimates Lego will have produced a *trillion* of

them by 2026.



RESOLUTION Lois Miriam Jacobsen Ringo Tivoli Lodge 300



Lois Jacobsen Ringo passed away peacefully on February 24, 2024 at the age of 102. She was proud of her Danish heritage. Her paternal grandparents immigrated from Aarhus, Denmark and her maternal grandparents from Nykobing, Denmark.

Lois was the eldest of six children and had a happy childhood growing up on the family farm in Irvington, Nebraska. After graduating from Irvington High School she went on to attend Dana College in Blair, Nebraska. She eventually went on to teach for five years in a one-room schoolhouse.

Lois married Earl Ringo on May 5, 1945. His career took them to Omaha and Hastings, Nebraska and then to Minneapolis, MN so that he could pursue his doctorate in education at the University of Minnesota. During this time they had six children: Karalee (deceased, a former member of Lodge 300), Kristin, Thomas, Malinda (current member of Ellen Lodge #21) and Karin. The family moved to Bozeman, Montana in 1965 where Earl was the Dean of the College of Education at Montana State University. After his passing in 1983, Lois embarked on a second career as the desk clerk at Hapner Hall at Montana State University.

Lois' artistic talents were expressed through her hobbies which included sewing, knitting, smocking, gardening, painting and flower arranging. She also found great pleasure in reading, working crossword puzzles and exploring the world through travel including a trip to Denmark in 1990 to explore her Danish roots.

She is deeply missed by her family and all that knew her.

On occasion Dagmar Lodge's monthly meetings are held before an event, whether at the Danish American Athletic Club (DAAC) preceding Fastlavn or at Bente and Lars Rasmussen's home for baking as well as for the Midwest District shared program.

This year's Midwest District, consisting of Kenosha and Chicago Sisterhood lodges, had an amazing presentation by Kenosha Danish Sister and National Representative Anna Nielsen who gave a wonderful presentation about all that's going on with the National Board as we lunched at a Libertyville restaurant. Lars and Bente opened their home for after-lunch activities including bunching into groups of two or three to figure out Danish Constitution Day trivia.

Wednesday 9/2:

Arrival at Comwell Hvide Hus Hotel in Aalborg. Check out the neighborhood. Registration and welcome dinner. Accommodation: Comwell Hvide Hus, Aalborg.





Thursday 9/3:

Visit the pretty and famous Heather Hills of Rebild, which includes meeting the president of the Rebild National Park Society, Mr. Jørgen B. Madsen at Hyldgaardsminde. See the sculptures in the park, walk to the July 4th location "Gryden", lunch at the Top Karen's Eatery, see the Western Log House, Rebild "Spillman" Museum, Thingbæk Chalk Mines and Exhibitions. Evening dinner at "Restaurant Gassen" ("The Gas Plant)", organized by The Danish American Club of Aalborg. Accommodation: Comwell Hvide Hus, Aalborg.

Friday 9/4:

Evening dinner at hotel. Danish songs and music by Iben Frost and Annemette Hübner. Accommodation: Hotel Skagen





Monday, 9/7:

Visit Karstensen's Ship Yard and experience some of the most modern trawlers in the world. Lunch on your own near harbor. Visit Skagen Museum, Anna Ancher's House, maybe afternoon coffee/tea at Brøndum's Hotel. Walk the streets of Skagen. Shop. Dinner somewhere. Accommodation: Hotel Skagen.





Tuesday, 9/8:

Visit the well known Eagle World Reserve (Ørnereservated) in Tversted, show and presentation. Continue to Hirtshals that is known for its fishing industry, the fantastic North Sea Oceanium, ferries to Norway and the WW2 Bunker Museum.

Dinner at Foldens Hotel's Viseværtshus, just a couple of minutes away.

Accommodation: Hotel Skagen.

Wednesday, 9/9:

Leave Skagen. Head towards Børglum kloster (convent), Full historical tour by owner, Drive to posh artisan village Lønstrup on the west coast, lunch on your own. Visit Ravgaarden (Gold of the North – The Amber Farm). Dinner at Løkken Badehotel (Seaside hHotel) Accommodation: Løkken Badehotel.

Thursday 9/10:

Some will get on the bus and participate in a post tour to Roskilde (Cathedral and Viking Ship Museum) and Copenhagen. Dinner at Tivoli. Dinner on your own. Accommodation: Hotel Imperial

Sunday, 9/13:

After breakfast participants will pack and continue their journeys. Saying goodbye.

Pricing and Refund Policy:

Price for the 12-day guided "Wild and Wonderful North Jutland" tour with a minimum of 30 participants is \$3,000 (per person – member price). Maximum of 40 participants

Prices are based on double occupancy. There is an additional charge of \$700 for a single room. Registration is open to members only until December 1. After this time non-members may register for an additional \$250 fee.

Please note price DOES NOT include airfare portion of the trip. Participants are responsible for their own transportation to and from the Comwell Hvide Hus in Aalborg. (Participants may join the post tour bus for transportation from Aalborg to Copenhagen for a fee.)

Deposit of \$1,000.00 per person is due at the time of booking.

Deadline for booking is April 1, 2026.

All final payments and additional fees (for non-members and single room) are due by June 1, 2026.

PHOTO RIGHT: *Rosenborg Castle in Copenhagen* houses some of Denmark's greatest cultural treasures. The castle was built 1606-34 by Christian IV as a pleasure palace. In the basement you will find the Danish crown jewels and royal crowns.

Rosenborg Castle was built by one of the most famous Danish kings, Christian IV, in the 17th century. The beautiful castle features 400 years of royal treasures, and the Crown Jewels and Royal Regalia.

Walk up the spiral steps and discover rooms filled with royal details and lavish portraits. Among the main attractions is the Knights' Hall with the coronation thrones, decorated with narwhal tusks, with three life-size silver lions standing guard. Tapestries on the walls commemorate battles between Denmark and Sweden. The interiors are well-preserved and invite you to take a journey in time, stepping into the shoes of the royalty that once lived here. You can see the king's private writing cabinet, his bathroom, and view wax figures of former royal inhabitants.

Rosenborg also houses an exquisite collection of Flora Danica and one of the world's finest Venetian glass collections, both set in tower chambers.





Denmark's Crown Jewels: The glittering crowns of the Danish kings and queens are kept in special vaults at Rosenborg Castle, embellished with table-cut stones, enamel, and gold.

The crown jewels primarily consist of four garnitures: a diamond set, a ruby set, a pearl set, and an emerald set, the emeralds being among the world's finest.

THE BEAUTY OF DENMARK AND THE JOY OF OUR NEW VICE PRESIDENT



Frederiksborg Castle is located in the middle of Hillerød on three islands in the castle lake. The oldest parts of the castle were built in 1560 by King Frederik II and the castle is named after him.

The majority of the present castle was built between 1600-1620 by Frederik II's son, Christian IV in Dutch Renaissance style with sweeping gables, sandstone decorations and copper-covered roofs and spires. The castle burnt in 1859 but was rebuilt from 1860-84 with financial support from brewer J. C. Jacobsen and later by the Carlsberg Foundation.

The part of the castle with the two low round towers on the southernmost island beside the S-bridge that connects the first and middle islets were part of Frederik II's original Frederiksborg as were the small Bath House between The Enclosure and the small Deer Park.
