This weekend marks the last celebration of the Christmas season, the Baptism of the Lord. The Lord's Baptism is an interesting spiritual conundrum. As a Church, we know that being baptized has lots of effects to it. Baptism is a character sacrament that gives us the gift of faith that is emblazoned on our souls and can't be taken away by anyone or anything. Baptism also inscribes us as a member of the Church. Finally, Baptism also removes the mark of the Original Sin of Adam and Eve. However, Jesus doesn't need any of those things! He doesn't need faith, because He is the source of faith. Our Lord didn't need to become a member of the Church, because He came to establish the Church. Lastly, Christ did not need to be absolved from sin, because He was like us in all things, BUT sin. So, why did Jesus allow Himself to be baptized? Ultimately it was so that He could be an example for us and what Christ demonstrates, we are called to imitate. Really it's the purpose of the whole sacramental life of the Church. God doesn't need the sacraments. We do. Our Lord gives them to us as a gift. Oftentimes we have the mentality that we come to Mass or go to confession or be married or confirmed because God needs us to. That couldn't be further from the truth. The reality is that He desires us to share in His life and gives us these 7 tools to help us experience that life fully. God WANTS us to be a part of the Church and celebrate the sacraments for OUR sake, not His. Whenever we learn about why we do the things that we do as a Church, it helps us more fully appreciate the gift of His love. Of course, the fullest expression of God's love and the most important of the Sacraments is the Eucharist. To that end, starting next week and for the next 6 Sundays, Fr. Britto and I will go over a different aspect of Mass about 15 minutes or so before Mass begins. If you remember, the whole diocese did this several years ago. We'll be going through the same materials and handouts as before. It's always good to have a refresher every once in awhile, especially as we strive to grow stronger in our faith. As we celebrate this last feast day of the Christmas season, let us ask our Lord to increase our faith and give an even greater witness to His love in the world in which we live.



FYI - The Christmas season used to end on February 2nd, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (also known as *Candlemas* or the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary). The significance of February 2nd is that it's 40 days after Christmas (another harkening to a time of preparation). So, if you're not quite ready to take down your decorations, there is a rationale for you to keep them up!



To spice things up and to hang onto the last vestiges of Christmas, I found a recipe for a classic Chess Pie. Apparently it is a staple of Southern confections and sweets. It reminds me a little of the German Buttercake that my mom makes for Fat Tuesday. Give it a shot and let me know what you think! <https://www.southernliving.com/recipes/classic-chess-pie>




Each session will include a simple explanation paired with age-appropriate activity and coloring sheets, to help children engage in a meaningful way. Jesus said, "*Let the children come to me.*" So don't worry, come as you are, and let the children come.

Understanding the Mass

10 Minute Mini-Talks

Prior to each Weekend Mass

Many people, even those who have practiced their faith their whole lives, may never have had the opportunity to sit down and learn about the Mass in a clear and intentional way. We all benefit from occasional refreshers on what the Mass is and why we do what we do.

Beginning next weekend January 17-18, Fr. Rob and Fr. Britto will offer 10-minute Teachable Moments: Understanding the Mass prior to our Saturday evening and Sunday morning Masses.

Over the course of the next six weeks, these brief 10-minute explanations will explore the various parts of the Mass, helping us better understand how the faithful witness, pray, and believe what takes place each week.

These mini-talks are designed to benefit Catholics at every stage of their spiritual journey whether lifelong Catholics or newcomers, young or old, actively practicing or returning to the Church. They serve as a reminder of the beauty, meaning, and importance of the Holy Mass in our lives.

Jan 17 & 18: The Introductory Rites

Did you know that Mass begins when you are sent from Mass the previous Sunday, as everything you do during the week is preparation for the coming Sunday; and then it explains the prayers and actions, such as genuflection, procession, participation in the opening song, the act of penance, Gloria and opening prayer or collect.

Jan 24 & 25: Liturgy of the Word

Do you know the 'whys' to the First and Second Scriptural readings, the Responsorial Psalm, as well as the proclamation of the Gospel, the homily, the Profession of Faith and the Prayers of the Faithful.

Jan 31, Feb 1: Preparation of the Altar

Learn more about the proper setting of the altar table with specific vessels and clothes, their names and places on the table, the collection and presentation of the gifts, prayers over the gifts and the Washing of Hands.


PB&J Outreach




