We often don't think of the transition between the Baptism of the Lord, the last feast of the Christmas season, and the 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, other than perhaps the sad reality that all of the Christmas decorations are taken down. But liturgically, there is a distinct connection between the two that can help us over the next 5 weeks as we journey towards Lent. Directly following the Baptism of the Lord, all four gospels depict the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. John the Baptist prepares the way for the Christ and Ordinary Time is a time in which we walk with Jesus as He walks among us. Ordinary Time focuses on Christ's daily life and teaching and helps us experience ourselves, others and God in ordinary ways. As a Church we, too, are called to move from Baptism into ministry. While many of us were baptized as infants, it is the Church's hope that we, like the Lord, can grow in wisdom, age and strength in order to go out to proclaim the Good News to our brothers and sisters. It is my hope and prayer that we may use this "normal" time in our lives to grow in holiness in the ordinary rhythm of our day, proclaiming that the Kingdom of God is at hand, and start getting ready for the next major liturgical season - Lent.

Italian chef, Francesco Mattana, cooked his version of ***Malloreddus alla Campidanese***, a signature dish from Sardinia. It looked delicious and I HAD to try it! I was not disappointed!!! One of the key ingredients is a pinch of saffron which really enhances the dish. The only issue is that saffron is one of the most expensive spices in the world. The flowers that comprise the spice have to be picked by hand and it takes 75,000 flowerets to make 1 pound of saffron. You can use turmeric as an alternative with a 1/4 to 1 ratio to saffron. Here it is! Serves 4:

1 white onion, finely chopped
2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
1 pinch of salt
1 1/4 pounds of sweet sausage (cases removed & cut into small pieces)
1 teaspoon of fennel seeds
100ml Vermentino or a dry white wine like Sauvignon Blanc
800g of tomato passata
Pinch of ground saffron threads (I bought a container and am willing to share!)
200ml reserved pasta water
1 pound of Gnocchetti Sardi (can be found on Amazon)
Grated pecorino and basil sprigs to serve

In a large non-stick pan, heat 2 tablespoons of olive oil on medium-low heat. Add the chopped onions with a pinch of salt and sauté slowly until it begins to caramelize. Add the sausage and the fennel seeds and cook the sausage until lightly browned (you may want to up the heat to medium for this part). Add in the white wine and let it cook off on medium-low heat. Then add the passata, the pinch of saffron (or 1/4 pinch of turmeric) and stir until all the ingredients are combined. Let the sauce cook for 30 to 40 minutes stirring occasionally. Boil the pasta to 2 minutes less than the directions and drain, reserving 200ml of pasta water. Add the pasta and the pasta water to the sauce until all of the pasta is coated. Serve with grated pecorino and add basil sprig for garnish. Enjoy!!!




Online Giving

Taking your young family to Adoration can feel daunting but it doesn't have to be. We've created a **family-friendly Adoration experience** where children of all ages are welcome to come and spend time with Jesus. Jesus *loves* to be with your whole family, even when toddlers squirm and children whisper.

We'll begin with **15-minute sessions**, gradually building up over time, so everyone can encounter Jesus at their own pace. It's okay if children fidget or whisper as this is a learning experience rooted in love and reverence. Each session will include a simple explanation paired with age-appropriate activity and coloring sheets, to help children engage in a meaningful way. Jesus said, "*Let the children come to me.*" So don't worry, come as you are, and let the children come.

These talks are designed to benefit Catholics at every stage of the spiritual journey: lifelong parishioners and newcomers alike; young and old; those actively practicing the faith as well as those returning to the Church. They offer a renewed appreciation for the beauty, meaning, and importance of the Mass in our daily lives.

Jan 24 & 25: Liturgy of the Word

Explore role of a Lector as well as the reasons behind the First and Second Scriptural readings, the Responsorial Psalm, the proclamation of the Gospel, the homily, the Profession of Faith and the Prayers of the Faithful.

Jan 31 & Feb 1: Preparation of the Altar

Details the proper setting of the altar table with specific vessels and clothes, their names and places on the table, the collection and presentation of the gifts, prayers over the gifts and the Washing of Hands.

Feb 7 & 8: The Preface and Eucharistic Prayer

Details the singing/speaking of the Preface, the Sanctus, the Epiclesis, the Memorial Acclamation, the Great Doxology and the Amen.

Feb 14 & 15: The Rite of Communion

Dismissal and the Concluding Details the Our Father, Rite of Peace, Fraction, Agnus Dei, Communion Procession and Song, and how to properly receive the Eucharist and Precious Blood.

Feb 21 & 22: The Dismissal Rite

Details the Prayer after Communion, the Concluding Rites, the Final Blessing, the Procession, as well as the importance of sacred music, liturgical colors and incense.






