On this feast of the Epiphany, I'm sure we're all aware of the gifts of the Magi and what these symbolize: gold, frankincense and myrrh for Jesus' role as king, high priest and prophet respectively. We even realize that by virtue of our own baptism that we participate in that kingship, priesthood and prophetic role. But the eternal question is, "**HOW** do we do that?" How are we to be reflections of Jesus as priest, prophet and king? Here are some possible practical examples: The common priesthood of the baptized focuses on turning our lives into an offering. We can pray daily and participate in the sacraments, especially the Eucharist. We can offer our work, joys, and sufferings to God and help sanctify the world by living our everyday, ordinary lives in holiness. To share in Christ's prophetic role is to give witness to the truth of the Gospel. Prophets weren't fortune tellers or sooth sayers, but were called to speak God's will to His people. As prophets, we proclaim the Gospel through our words and actions by teaching the faith, by speaking out for justice, human dignity, and moral truth—even when it's uncomfortable and inconvenient. Jesus as King of Heaven and Earth just doesn't rule over our lives but serves us out of love. To reign is to serve—starting with ruling our own hearts. Firstly, we serve by exercising self-mastery and resisting sin in our own lives. That allows us to grow in both grace and virtue. Secondly, we serve others, especially the poor and marginalized, as we strive to bring God's justice, peace, and mercy into society. Pope Benedict XVI on the Feast of the Epiphany in 2007 spoke that, "*The Epiphany of Christ, therefore, is at the same time the epiphany of the Church, the manifestation of her universal vocation and mission.*" Namely, the Epiphany is a not-so-subtle reiteration of our call to grow in holiness and the mandate to teach the faith, preach the Gospel and celebrate the Sacraments. Every Christian life is meant to be priestly in prayer and self-gift, prophetic in truth and witness and kingly in service and love. This is not only our gift to God, but also the living out of our baptism. As the opening prayer proclaims, "O God, who by the leading of a star manifested your only Son to the peoples of the earth: mercifully grant that we, who know you now by faith, may at last behold your glory face to face".

One of the traditional sweets for the Feast of the Epiphany is la Rosca de Reyes or "the Wreath of the Kings". Filled with cinnamon, nuts, dried fruit and citrus zest, this tasty treat would go great as a part of our celebration of the 3 Kings! 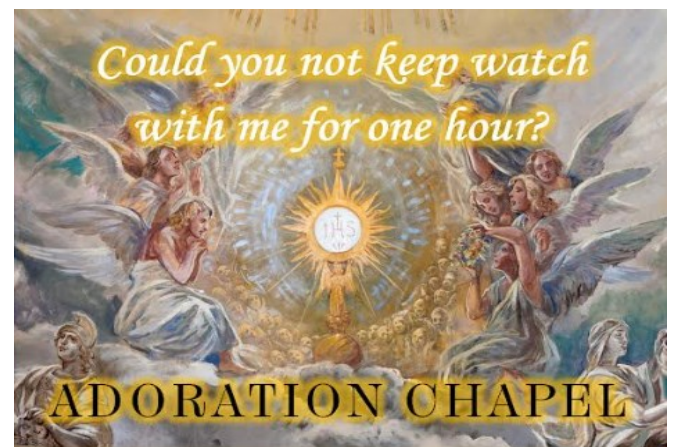

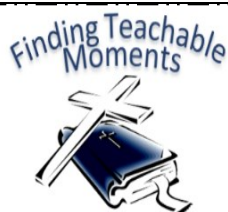

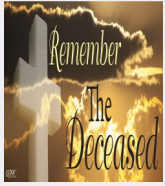
