Exiit qui seminat - "The sower goes out to sow"



Our diocese has, from the beginning, been a diocese of immigrants. The Diocese of Camden was formally established by Pope Pius XI in 1937, carved out of the Diocese of Trenton, with the Church of the Immaculate Conception named as its cathedral. The new diocese was founded to serve the growing Catholic population of South Jersey, which had seen waves of Irish, Italian, and other Catholic immigrants over the decades. My mother's family, all of German descent, came to this country and settled in Egg Harbor City, a German farming enclave. Their parish was St. Nicholas where my illustrious predecessor, Fr. Joe Ganiel, was born and raised. While Germans and the Irish had been the earlier settlers of South Jersey, by the turn of new century, there were 14,000 Catholics of Polish descent in New Jersey. Many of the parishes through the diocese, especially the affectionately monikered, "St. Joe's Polish" helped serve our Polish brothers and sisters (including our own). The early presence of Italian citizens in South Jersey was a presence crucial to the growth of Catholicism in the region. In 1880, the first Catholic Church in New Jersey for Italian Catholics was Saint Paul of the Cross in "New Italy," north of Vineland. Both St. Mary's in East Vineland and Our Lady of Pompeii were established in the late 1800s/early 1900s to minister to the Italian farming community there. In fact, the parishes and the school, and eventually St. Augustine Prep, were a part of the Italian sub-province of the group of Augustinians out of St. Thomas of Villanova. In 1953, the first Bishop of Camden, Bartholomew J. Eustace, erected the first parish for Hispanic Catholics. Today, our diocese serves almost 120,000 Hispanic and Latino Catholics through the ministry and assistance of over 30 parishes. Throughout her history in South Jersey, the Diocese of Camden has been faithfully served by priests and religious from around the world. Argentina, Columbia, El Salvador, Haiti, India, Ireland, Malta, Mexico, The Philippines, Poland, South Korea, Vietnam and Uganda all have sent priests to the Diocese of Camden so that we can have access to the sacraments, especially the Eucharist (and I'm sure I'm missing a few). Many foreign priests send much of their salary home to help their families and their home diocese. Many priests and religious have become US citizens. Others are currently in the process as religious workers to obtain their Green Card. Under current law, foreign-born religious workers are permitted to live and work in the United States temporarily through the nonimmigrant religious worker (R-1) visa, like our own Fr. Britto. The R-1 visa is limited to five years, after which the religious worker must depart the United States for at least one year before possibly returning on a subsequent R-1 visa. Previously, religious workers of many different faiths legally present in the country on an R-1 visa could apply for and receive permanent residency within those five years. Unfortunately, there is now a significant backlog in the visa category relied upon by these religious workers, along with several other classes of immigrants, for that purpose. This backlog means a priest or other worker who applies today will be forced to wait more than a decade before being able to receive permanent residency in the United States. This is unsustainable for the religious organizations that depend on these workers, as well as the workers themselves who have committed to serving our communities. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has worked to introduce the Religious Workforce Protection Act that would allow priests like Fr. Britto to remain in the United States by extending the R-1 visa and work towards permanent residency while continuing to minister to parishes like our own. 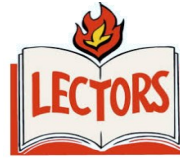

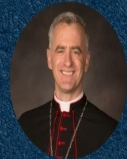

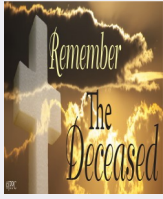
