Exiit qui seminat - "The sower goes out to sow"

This week we delve into the final aspect of Pope Leo XIV's 6 fundamental points following the path of the 2nd Vatican Council: **courageous and trusting dialogue with the contemporary world in its various components and realities**. As the beginning of *Gaudium et Spes* (Joys and Hopes), the Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World, speaks to us, "... *this Second Vatican Council, having probed more profoundly into the mystery of the Church, now addresses itself without hesitation, not only to the sons of the Church and to all who invoke the name of Christ, but to the whole of humanity*" (GS 2). Since her founding by Christ, the Church has always been engaged in the world. At times, this engagement is confrontational, when the world is in error, or even worse, in open conflict that leads to persecution. The Church, as Christ intended, also stands as a corrective, upholding divine truth and the demands of love. In other times, the Church acts as teacher and guide, sharing the riches of over 2000 years of tradition and guidance of the Holy Spirit with the whole entire world. Still others, the Church gives witness, upholding the dignity of all human life as being made in the image and likeness of God, especially in which that dignity has been threatened or violated. Finally, the Church is a light that illuminates the world with faith, hope and love and shines clearly upon truth. Ultimately, the dialogue the Church has with the world, while often times at odds, is not meant to be antagonistic. While there are certainly things in this world that are not of God and are far from Him, the Lord still is the author of all creation and of all things that are good. God created the world and us out of love. It is only because of human disobedience and the effects of sin and death that lead to the disordered nature of our existence. In spite of all of our differences ideologically, theologically, politically, etc., all of us are Children of God, even if we don't recognize ourselves as such. As the Church, we are called to meet people where they are, but we are also never complacent. We never allow individuals, peoples or nations to remain stagnant. Rather, the Church becomes a beacon of hope that guides us home in the midst of seemingly overwhelming darkness. Listening and understanding are integral aspects of building up relationships. In this time and age, it is these relationships that foster the trust necessary for catechesis and evangelization to occur. As Pope St. John Paul II stated, "By dialogue, we let God be present in our midst, for as we open ourselves to one another, we open ourselves to God." So how do we incorporate this dialogue in the world in which we live?

Here are several principles to keep in mind:

1. **Begin with Curiosity, Not Combat:** Ask questions to understand why the other person believes what they do, rather than jumping in to correct. Try to show interest in their ideas without judging. Correction can come later.
2. **Look for Common Ground:** It's often obvious to identify the things that divide us. It can take real effort to point out the things we have in common. These can be jumping off points for deeper conversations.
3. **Acknowledge Emotions as well as Ideas:** Oftentimes disagreements aren't just intellectual, they're tied to very strong emotions. Stating that we can see how a person would feel a certain way goes a long way to furthering a conversation.
4. **Practice Active Listening:** Try to restate what we've heard from other people. That way we avoid misinterpreting what we've heard.
5. **Be Precise and Define Terms:** Speak clearly and to the point. Speak to the issue and not the quality of the person speaking. Words can have multiple meanings. Ask the other person to explain what a word means in the context of the situation at hand.
6. **Know When to Take a Break:** If things get a little heated, don't be afraid to stop and come back to the discussion later. Trust is built over time and not in a single debate.
7. **Prioritize the Relationship Over the Argument:** Sometimes it's more important to leave the door open for future conversations than to "win" the present one.

In his general audience on September 24th in St. Peter's Square, Pope Leo XIV spoke about when people are in times of trial, they can be confident that God is there ready to rescue and redeem them. "*No place is too far way, no heart is too closed (and) no tomb too tightly sealed for his love.*" Let our own hearts be filled with this same hope and promise as we engage the world through the people, places and situations that surround us!
