ALL SOULS DAY



This Sunday, November 2nd, is the start of **National Vocations Awareness Week**. It's an annual week-long celebration of the Catholic Church in the United States dedicated to promoting vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life through prayer and education, as well as renewing our prayers and support for those who are considering one of these particular vocations. It would be easy (and in many ways appropriate) to speak of the declining number or priests in our diocese. The year I was ordained a priest with Fr. Michael Goyette, 2024, the Diocese of Camden lost 14 priests to either death or retirement. It is sobering to say the least. In reality, we are **EXTREMELY** fortunate

to still have at least one priest in every parish. But rather than focus on the negative in terms of priestly vocations, I think it important to focus on the great joy that I feel every day as a priest. *Is every day easy?* No. *Are there days that I am exhausted?* Sure! But I truly love what I do. Why, then, wouldn't I want to approach each day with joy? In truth, no one wants to imitate a miserable Christian. While it cannot be denied that there should be a seriousness and dedication in our pursuit of holiness, nor will our lives ever be free of difficulties and crosses, these things must not rob us of our joy! I love celebrating the sacraments and am energized being with the People of God. I am a firm believer in this quote and desire of Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, "*May you always experience the joy that comes from putting Christ as the center of your lives.*" While I do have a normal-ish schedule of my days, each day can be filled with surprises. You never know what challenges you will face or what you will be asked to do. Working for God as His priest keeps me grounded in the moment and helps me be present minded. I may struggle with planning and preparing for the future, there is a freedom literally taking one day at a time. The Lord has an uncanny ability to put me where He needs me. I cannot tell you how often I am in the right place at the right time for someone who needs God's presence in their lives. Also, as a priest, I accompany people in every aspect of their lives - from womb to tomb. I celebrate their joys and give them the Lord's comfort in their sorrows. It is truly a grace to accompany others in the best and most difficult moments of their lives. It brings me great joy to celebrate the sacraments, to preach and to teach the faith. I really have to pinch myself sometimes that this is what I get to do. And while the "job" has certainly gotten harder and priests are called to do more with less, I am still hopeful for the future. It's not like God has stopped calling men to the priesthood or even that He is calling others less. I am happy to continue to pray the diocesan vocations prayer from several years ago, I think it can be interpreted as a misnomer for Jesus to increase vocations to the priesthood. I think the Lord has called the right amount of men to be His priests. I think it's absolutely essential to encourage these men to come forward. That's where **Called By Name** comes in. By using the relationships that we already have, our parish can prayerfully consider young men in high school and older who may have the qualities of a future priest. In this way we can ensure that our Church will have the ministers she needs to help bring others to Christ and the sacraments necessary to get to heaven.

Attached is a picture from my time in the seminary. I THINK it was around 2002-2003. Out of the 21 men in the photo, 14 of us made it to priesthood (*Fathers Bartoloma, Romano, Pham, Rivera, Caparas, Rossi, Canales, Pinzon, King, Thomas, Dudo, Markellos, Kiely and yours truly*). That's not too shabby if you ask me! We're all much younger and thinner in this photo. They were good times and a great group of guys!

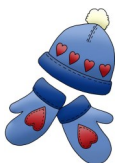

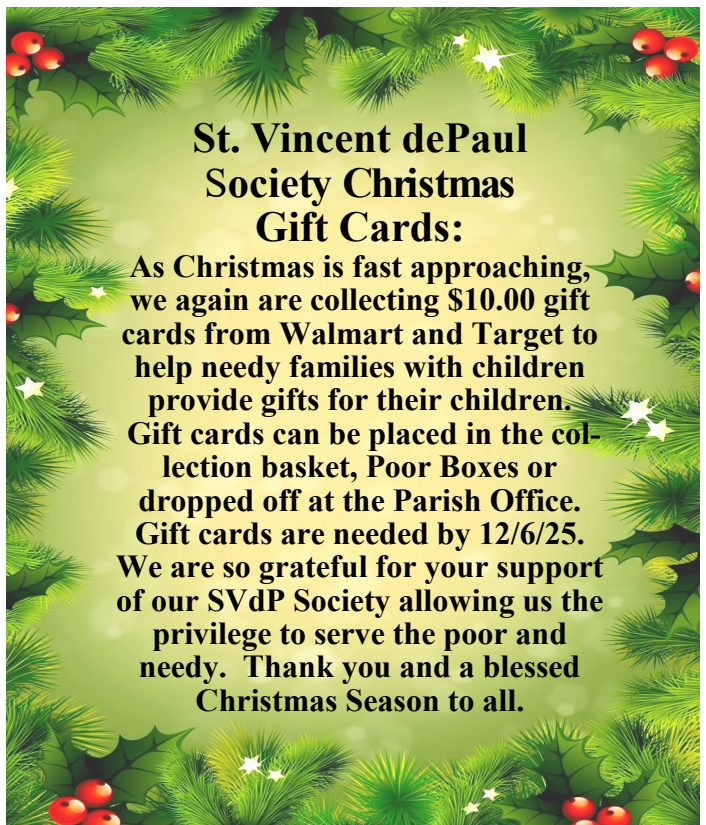

Men's SJ Emmaus Retreat



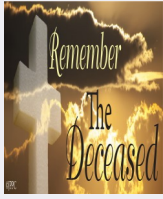
