Monday, December 8th, is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception and a Holy Day of Obligation. In Church terms, this is a fairly recent feast, proclaimed in the papal decree *Ineffabilis De*us (Ineffable God) on December 8, 1854. But even more important, Pope Pius IX exercised his full authority of the pope and declared this dogma using papal infallibility. This concept as a whole can be difficult to explain and I hope to unpack it as clearly as I can. Let's lay down some basic ideas. First, papal infallibility DOES NOT mean that the pope can't make a mistake. Rather it involves the pope's role as chief teacher of the faith. When the pope speaks and teaches in a definitive way on faith and morals, that teaching is protected by the Holy Spirit. But it's not like the pope can say that Jesus is not God. That teaching has to be in communion with the deposit of faith. Papal infallibility allows the Holy Father to define doctrines and dogma that come into dispute and need clarification and ruling. God's law and how it is expressed in the world cannot change, but often needs to be defined and/or protected that's where the pope's teaching authority comes into play. Another confusing aspect of the doctrine of papal infallibility is that it recognizes that there is a difference and separation between the man who occupies the papacy and office of actually being the Successor of Peter. For example, Pope Leo XIV is a Chicago White Sox fan. He could publicly say that the White Sox are the greatest baseball team that has ever lived. However that statement has nothing to do with God's plan of salvation and not considered infallible. Also, a pope can have opinions about the life of the Church and world affairs. Having an opinion and speaking on it does not mean that it's papal infallibility in action. It's the opinion of the person who occupies the office of pope. When teaching on faith and morals there are two primary levels of papal infallibility: Extraordinary, where a pope makes a solemn, ex cathedra definition on faith or morals, and Ordinary, where a pope teaches infallibly through the ordinary magisterium by upholding doctrines that are already part of the Church's constant, universal teaching. *Ex cathedra* statements are when the Holy Father (in this case Blessed Pius IX) speaks with full apostolic authority as the Successor of St. Peter. Since the concept of papal infallibility was defined during the 1st Vatican Council (1869-1870), there has only been two ex cathedra statements: the declarations of the Immaculate Conception and the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Ordinary papal infallibility is grounded in the teaching authority of the Church (called the Magisterium) and usually involves already defined doctrine and dogma. When new issues develop like Artificial Intelligence, that are not expressly discussed in Sacred Scripture or in the Tradition of the Church, the Holy Father does have the ability to "trailblaze" as long as his teaching does not actively contradict what has already been established by the deposit of faith. Now there is a part of me, that as I type this, that fears that I have been as clear as mud. If you happen to have any further questions on the topic, I'd be happy to answer any questions you might have!

# INFANT OF PRAGUE NOVENA

January 5 to 13 Novena - January 14 Feast Mass St Teresa Church - 7pm

The Novena to the Infant of Prague is a cherished devotion centered on the mystery of the Christ Child, God made flesh. The tradition of nine days of prayer comes from the Apostles and the Blessed Mother, who spent nine days in prayer between the Ascension and Pentecost (Acts 1:12 14). This became the model for Christian novenas throughout history.

The devotion to the Infant Jesus highlights the humility of the Incarnation, God choosing to come among us as a child and recalls the Gospel scenes of Jesus' childhood found in Matthew and Luke.

The crowned Infant holding a globe symbolizes Christ's kingship and His loving care over the world. In turn, the Novena to the Infant of Prague invites the faithful to come before the Christ Child with childlike confidence, entrusting our needs to the One who said: "Ask and you shall receive." Through this devotion, we remember that even in His infancy, Jesus is our King, our Provider, and our ever-present source of hope.


