Baptisms are currently being held during our weekend Masses on **Sundays immediately following the 11am Mass.** Please call the **Parish Office** to schedule a baptism or for more information.

The winter storm last Sunday was certainly felt throughout the Delaware Valley and at the time of my writing on Tuesday afternoon on January 27th, yet ANOTHER storm seems to be looming for the weekend. The eternal question when it snows on a Sunday is whether or not there will be Mass. As your pastor, let me assure you, Mass is NEVER cancelled. Sometimes we use that type of nomenclature because we don't want our parishioners to put themselves at risk. If there is an intention for Mass (and there almost always is one), the priest is OBLIGATED to celebrate that Mass for the purpose designated and the obligation needs to be fulfilled on the date in question. The priests of the parish will ALWAYS celebrate Mass for the faithful, even if the faithful aren't there. That's our job (and it's pretty easy to walk across the landing between the rectory and sacristy at St. Maria Goretti). The deeper question is, 'What is the obligation and requirement of the faithful in attending Mass?' Firstly, attending Mass and keeping holy the Sabbath is a commandment (the 3rd one) and part of the divine law. Sunday Mass should always be our priority so that we can worship God and enter into communion with Him and one another. However, if there is a serious extenuating circumstance, like we're sick or in the hospital, homebound, taking care of a sick loved one, or even blizzard-like conditions, the obligation is, by the nature of events, dispensed. Our Lord does not expect the impossible, nor would He hold us responsible for things that are beyond our control. Now sometimes attending Mass might take some effort, like finding a Mass while we're on vacation or our children have a sporting event or there may be a unique function or event. In those types of circumstances, the obligation to attend Mass holds fast. The stark reality is that our priorities can become skewed and we can struggle to make time for the things and the person that are most important in our lives. Just like we wouldn't miss a meal, we shouldn't miss the Bread of Life that nourishes our souls. So what happens if we have a repeat of last Sunday? If there is a state of emergency in which it is recommended that non-essential vehicles stay off the road, be prudent and stay safe. Mass, when necessary, will be celebrated privately. The parish will communicate our decisions through Facebook, the parish website and through Global Connect. In those cases in which we might have to stay home, the faithful are encouraged to keep the Sabbath in another way. Reflect on the daily Mass readings at www.usccb.org. Pray the rosary. Watch Bishop Barron's Sunday Sermon on YouTube. Read the Bible. There are lots of things you can do to take time to spend with our Lord. In addition, please pray for those who have to work in these difficult weather conditions and our brothers and sisters in need who have no shelter from the storm. Please know that whether you're reading this online, or you actually have a bulletin in your hand in Church, that we, as a parish, are always united together in our highest form of prayer - the Mass!

I made a delicious lasagna on Sunday night. I used some leftover sauce (or gravy if that's in your lexicon) from my meatballs and interspersed it with Béchamel sauce instead of ricotta cheese. It makes for a creamier and richer dish, especially with a traditional meat sauce. I used this recipe for mine: <https://www.allrecipes.com/recipe/139987/basic-bechamel-sauce/> Just be care when you pour the milk into the butter and flour mixture. I got splashed a little bit. It was not fun.

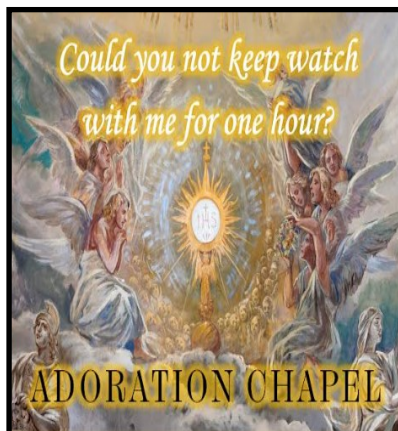

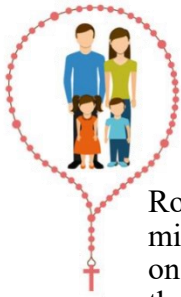

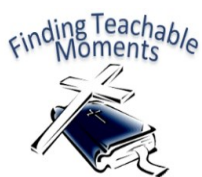
As Lent approaches, we are reaching out to the members of our parish to assist us with this important blessed ministry. We are in need of two types of adorers:

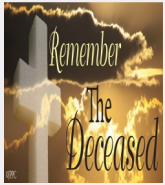
