Happy Belated Valentine's Day ... sort of! From the early life of the Church, she has identified TWO different St. Valentines who were/are the same person: St. Valentine of Rome or St. Valentine of Terni. Tradition states that he was a 3rd century priest or bishop who ministered to persecuted Christians. He was martyred in 270 AD and his body buried on the Via Flaminia, one of the ancient roads leading to Rome, on February 14th. Other than the fact that St. Valentine was mentioned in some early documents on the lives of the martyrs there's not a whole lot that we know about him. St. Valentine's feast day was removed from the liturgical calendar as a part of the restructuring of the Roman calendar of saints as a part of the 2nd Vatican Council. Pope St. Paul VI authorized this change in the document *Mysterii Paschalis* to reduce the number of saints that have mostly pious (and non-historical) backgrounds. Along with St. Valentine, about 200 other saints were removed from the calendar. Such saints include St. Christopher, St. Catherine of Alexandria, St. Barbara and St. Ursula, along with early popes and martyrs. Other saints, like St. Hippolytus, St. Dorothy, St. George and St. Ceceila saw changes to their feast days. On the flipside, the Church added feast days to saints from other parts of the world like Africa and Asia. We celebrated the feast day of St. Paul Miki and his companions last Friday, February 6th, and the Church added the feast day of St. Charles Lwanga and the Ugandan martyrs on June 3rd. While saints have been taken off the liturgical calendar for the universal Church, *Mysterii Paschalis* does not prevent local churches that have particular devotions to these "removed" saints from celebrating them. In the Latin Church (aka the Roman Catholic Church), we celebrate the feast day of Ss. Cyril and Methodius on February 14th. These brothers, born in Thessalonica in the early 800s, were both theologians and missionaries to the Slavs and brought the Christian faith to them. Their claim to fame is that they took the Slavonic language and created an alphabet for it. Once the alphabet was in place they translated parts of the Bible and created a liturgy using the newly codified language. The basis of that language still exists today and is named after St. Cyril - the Cyrillic alphabet. Cyrillic is used by over 50 languages including Russian, Ukrainian, Belarusian, Bulgarian, Serbian and Macedonian. The work of Ss. Cyril and Methodius influenced the impetus of using the vernacular (like English) in the liturgy instead of Latin or Greek. So, as Lent creeps around the corner (and starting your penance a little early):

Roses are red.

Songs are melodious.

Happy Feast Day of Saints Cyril and Methodius!

So, I was recently watching cooking videos on Facebook and found Italian chef, Francesco Mattana. This is the second of his recipes that I have made - Spinach and Ricotta Gnudi (aka Naked Ravioli). It wasn't SUPER labor intensive, but it does require some forethought to make. While you can use a normal "red sauce" this recipe lends itself more to the savory butter and sage sauce included. 
Pre-Jordan Class

Lent Begins on Ash Wednesday, February 18 Embrace the Journey

How do you celebrate Lent? Yes, *celebrate!* So often Lent is seen as a season of “have to” ... *I have to give something up. I have to skip meat on Fridays.* But Lent isn’t about loss for the sake of loss. It’s about **love**. When we pause and ask *why* the Church invites us into sacrifice, we’re gently led back to gratitude. Gratitude for Jesus, who freely gave up everything out of love for us. Lent becomes less about what *we* are doing and more about remembering what **He has already done**, preparing us to celebrate the greatest mysteries of our faith: the **Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ**.

These are not distant events from long ago, they are living realities that continue to shape our lives today, inviting us to slow down and prepare our hearts and mind, making space for God to work in us. So the question, then, is this: **How are you preparing your heart and mind to truly celebrate all that Jesus gave up for you?** When we take the time to ask that question sincerely, Lent becomes deeply personal. Our fasting, prayer, and almsgiving are no longer obligations, but responses to grace. This season is not about perfection but about transformation. It’s about trusting that God is at work and being willing to cooperate with Him as He prepares our hearts for the joy of the Resurrection.

Prayer

Prayer is a conversation with God, a time to both *speak and listen*. Lent offers a beautiful opportunity to deepen conversations with God but also with family and friends, walking together in faith.

- Count your daily blessings on your way to work or school
- Go to daily Mass an extra day or two outside of Sunday
- Prayer the Rosary as a family in the car
- Come to Stations of the Cross on Wednesdays 12Noon or Fridays at 7PM
- Take time to visit the Adoration Chapel for a few minutes during the week



Fasting



Fasting can be more than only abstaining from some kind of food or drink during Lent. Lent invites us to notice the many *ordinary, daily* moments where we can practice abstaining or simplicity. When offered intentionally, these simple fasts become quiet prayers *learning to desire Christ more than comfort*.

- Take the worst parking spot you can find
- Turn the radio off in the car
- Eat more simply overall
- Refrain swear or gossip
- Avoid buying any ‘extra’ treats or snacks

Almsgiving

Almsgiving is often defined as giving to the poor. But like fasting and prayer, almsgiving can be **so much more** than what first comes to mind. At its heart, almsgiving is an act of **justice**. It’s a response that delights the heart of God when we care for our neighbor, especially those who are overlooked, burdened, or in need of encouragement. It is about generosity of heart, time, attention, and compassion, not only generosity of money.

Did you ever consider ...

- Each day of Lent, write an affirmation or encouraging note to someone
- Make a meal for a neighborhood or family, just because
- Perform a random act of kindness for someone, with no expectation in return


