As I enter into my 22nd Lent as a priest, I'm always caught by surprise at the arrival of this holy season. Perhaps, it's because the season of Lent (from the Old English *lencten*, meaning spring or springtime) always is different. The celebration of Easter shifts from March 22nd at its earliest to April 25th at its latest and so the 40 liturgical days prior can be on differing dates. When you're in the habit of looking at one day at a time in terms of scheduling (like I do) there is a real chance to be caught spiritually flatfooted. In addition, Lent is a season that is meant for us to withdraw in some ways (by giving things up) and engage in others (when we add spiritual practices to our lives). When we are busy and our days are full, we may not be ready to slow down and, at the same time, reflect and act. It's like a car traveling at high speeds that suddenly needs to stop. We hit the brakes. The car skids, swerves and fishtails and often, we stop well past the point that we needed to. So, if you're like me and not QUITE ready for Lent, I have included THROUGH THE POWER OF THE INTERNET to give all of us one Lenten practice for the next 7 days. Each Sunday of Lent, I'll include 7 more. That way the whole parish can participate in the Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving in the same way, uniting us as a community of faith (and, of course, helping spiritual procrastinators like myself have a no nonsense program in order to turn away from sin and embrace the Gospel. Let me know how you do!



1. Fast from One Small Comfort: Jesus fasted in the desert. Choose one simple comfort (*dessert, scrolling before bed, fancy coffee*) and give it up intentionally. Let the little hunger remind you: “Man does not live on bread alone.”

2. Pray with Scripture for 5 Minutes Today: Each time Satan tempts Him, Jesus responds with Scripture. Read a short Gospel passage each day and sit with one line. No need to overcomplicate it — just let the Word anchor you.

3. Name Your Top Temptation: Jesus faced temptations of appetite, power, and pride. Ask yourself: what pulls at me most right now? Comfort? Control? Attention? Once you name it, you weaken its grip.

4. Practice a Hidden Act of Faith: The devil tempts Jesus to make a dramatic public display. Do one quiet act of faith this week — a hidden kindness, anonymous generosity, or private prayer. Let it be just between you and God.

5. Trust God in One Concrete Area: “Do not put the Lord your God to the test.” Where are you trying to control everything? Choose one situation and consciously surrender it in prayer each day.

6. Simplify One Space: The desert is uncluttered. Clean out one drawer, shelf, or digital folder. Offer the simplicity as a spiritual reset — less noise, more clarity.

7. End the Week with a 2-Minute Examen: Before bed, ask: *Where was I tempted today? Where did I choose God? Where do I need grace tomorrow?*


Pre-Jordan Class

Gospel Reflection

“Come, Let’s see what your life can become.”

Levi (Matthew) wasn’t just any outsider, he was a tax collector, someone many people would have considered corrupt and beyond spiritual hope. Yet Jesus didn’t begin with correction. He began with a call: *“Follow me.”* Jesus accepted Matthew **for who he was and where he was** and not as a project to fix. There was no precondition, just come as you are. That’s the beauty of Jesus’ approach; acceptance was not the end; it was the beginning. He loved Matthew as he was but also loved him too much to leave him where he was. The relationship opened a horizon of possibility knowing ... You are SEEN ... You are VALUED ... You are LOVED.

This is such a powerful Lenten reflection. Repair doesn’t start with shame; it starts with being welcomed. And once someone feels safe and known, they can risk stepping into something new. The same is true for us. Jesus meets us exactly where we are in our strengths, our habits, our compromises and gently says, *“Come. Let’s see what your life can become.”* And that kind of love changes everything.




