Last Sunday was, in a word, UNBELIEVABLE. There was such a radical dichotomy throughout the whole day. When I was taking Batman for his walk at 7 AM, it was almost perfect. The weather was calm (and warm). The world was quiet. It seemed ridiculous that a Nor'easter like Winter Storm Hernando was even possible. But starting at 2:30 PM, a few flakes turned into over a foot of snow! All one could do was watch. Hernando can be a good analogy for the spiritual life. One moment, every seems like it's going well. We're praying and not struggling focusing on God. Then, all of a sudden, an unexpected storm comes into our lives and turns our lives upside down! Everything spiritually becomes disrupted and we're buried under the weight of it all. The process of returning to "normal" (if there is such a thing) is actually the same as dealing with snow. We have to dig ourselves out a little bit at a time. We have to approach our spiritual issues in chunks, making sure that each shovelful is not too heavy to carry. Sometimes we have to carve things into smaller pieces in order to carry the load. And as always, we have to remember that we do not face our spiritual problems alone. Just as we witnessed friends and neighbors helping each other dig themselves out, so we, as a community of faith, lean on one another and pray for one another even when we don't know that the people that we are close to are struggling. Most important, we know that our merciful God has not abandoned us, and never will. We know with confidence that He will send snowplows to clear out the streets of our lives. We may need to be patient because God's time is not our time. Even if there are complications or setbacks, Lent and our faith remind us to persevere and keep on shoveling! While it might seem like forever, the weight of our issues will be moved out of the way and eventually melted by the light and warmth of the Son!



How did Week 1 go? I hope that you found last week's list helpful! Here is the list for the 2nd Week of Lent:

1. Climb One "Mountain" This Week: Choose one intentional step upward — attend daily Mass, spend 15 extra minutes in prayer, take a silent walk. Do something that lifts you out of routine.

2. Spend 10 Minutes in Silence: Set a timer. No music, no phone, no multitasking. Just sit quietly and say, "Speak, Lord. I'm listening."

3. Listen More Than You Speak: Pick one conversation each day where your goal is simply to listen deeply — no interrupting, no planning your reply.

4. Notice Glimpses of Glory: Each evening, name one moment of beauty, grace, or unexpected joy you saw that day. Train your eyes to catch the light.

5. Stay When Prayer Feels Boring: Intense spiritual experiences don't last. If prayer feels dry this week, stay anyway. Faith isn't built only on emotional highs.

6. Face One Fear with Trust: Identify one small fear (a difficult call, a tough conversation, a responsibility you're avoiding) and step toward it with prayer first.

7. Come Down the Mountain with Purpose: Choose one concrete act of service this week. Let your prayer lead to action.

Keep praying and keep up the good work!



Seeing Jesus, Following Jesus

In the Gospel today, we are invited into a deeply personal moment shared by Peter, James, and John. Within this moment, Jesus draws them up the mountain so that they may see Him clearly, before they must follow Him faithfully.

Throughout Scripture, the mountain is the place where God meets His people. Moses encounters God on Mount Sinai. Elijah hears the voice of God on the mountain. The Transfiguration prepares us for the cross. Jesus will soon descend the mountain and walk toward Golgotha, the hill where He will give His life. That hill becomes the ultimate meeting place between God and humanity, the place where heaven touches earth. The glory revealed in the Transfiguration points directly to the cross, where love shines brightest and light breaks through the deepest darkness.

This is where we, just as the disciples, can see Jesus for who He truly is and choosing to trust Him, even when the way forward seems unclear. Jesus does not invite us to remain on the mountaintop but invites us into relationship with Him. He reveals His glory so that we will not lose hope when life becomes difficult. Transfiguration invites us to live, being asked to not simply believe about Jesus but actively turns to Him again and again, allowing His light to shape daily choices.



Come let us adore Christ as we walk through and contemplate the passion, suffering and death which redeemed us.




