So far, it's been a generally cloudy and miserable winter. Back-to-back snowstorms. Temperatures in the single digits. It's been a mess. This week, thanks be to God, has been a bit of a reprieve. The temperature has been MUCH warmer and on Tuesday, after what seemed like forever, we have seen a great orb in the sky that gives both light and heat (aka the Sun). At the time of writing this article, the high temperature today will be a balmy 78 degrees! Considering the slog of winter, this break in the weather, even if it's temporary is JUST what the doctor ordered. As Deacon Dave preached so eloquently last Sunday, this is the point in time in which Lent becomes a more weighty. Our initial fervor fades and the seemingly good idea of our Lenten practices can become laborious. But the Church, like the weather, has given us a reprieve. This Sunday (often called *Laetare* Sunday) is a reminder that light is already breaking into Lent. Holy Week and Easter are closer than we think. The effort we have placed in turning away from sin and embracing the Gospel will be rewarded with the glory and celebration of the Risen Lord and the empty tomb. So hang in there! If we have faltered, use this week to bolster our resolve and get back to what works. If we were a little too ... ambitious in choosing our Lenten disciplines, make a bit of a course correction. Change things up if we have to! God hasn't given up on us. We, as we engage in prayer, fasting and almsgiving, shouldn't give up on Him and everything our Lord has done for us!



To that end, here are this week's simple acts to make this 4th week more meaningful:

- 1. Pray: "Lord, Help Me See.":** Begin each day with a simple prayer: "Lord, help me see what you are doing today."
- 2. Notice One Blessing Each Day:** Each evening, write down one thing you noticed today that you might normally overlook—a kindness, a moment of beauty, a small joy.
- 3. Avoid Quick Judgments:** Make a conscious effort this week to pause before judging someone or a situation.
- 4. Wash and Begin Again:** Choose one small reset this week: Go to Confession. Take a quiet prayer walk. Spend time in reflection asking God for renewal.
- 5. Speak Honestly About Your Faith:** Share one simple story of faith or gratitude with someone this week.
- 6. Stand Firm in What You Know Is Good:** Practice quiet courage—stand by what is right even in small moments
- 7. Follow Jesus More Closely:** Choose one way this week to follow Jesus more intentionally: extra prayer, reading the Gospel, or helping someone in need.





Put off the Old Self and put on the New Self

When the man born blind was healed, the people who had known him began to question whether he was really the same person. He simply replied, “**I am.**” Even though he looked the same on the outside, his life had been changed by an encounter with Jesus.

The same is true for us. Through Baptism we become followers of Christ and children of God. While we may look the same on the outside, something new begins within us. As St. Paul reminds us, we are called to “**put off the old self and**

put on the new self.”

As disciples of Jesus, this new life is seen in how we live: gathering for Mass, praying regularly, learning from Scripture, serving those in need, and treating others with kindness, honesty, and love. Like the healed man, not everyone may understand or accept this change. But we are called to remain courageous, living faithfully as disciples and witnessing to the difference Christ makes in our lives.






