Baptism Scheduling

Baptisms are currently being held during our weekend Masses on **Sundays immediately following the 11am Mass.** Please call the **Parish Office** to schedule a baptism or for more information.

Two weekends ago, at the 11 AM Mass, we had the Rite of Welcoming Acceptance. This is the part of the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (aka OCIA) where the Church formally welcomes a person inquiring about being baptized who has now made the decision to enter into the Church. At that point, that person is known as a Catechumen (from the Greek *Κατηχούμενος*, meaning "one being instructed"). The Catechumenate refers to a period of instruction in the faith before baptism and admission into the Catholic Church. Last Sunday (because of Snow-My-Goodness 2026), the diocese celebrated the Rite of Election. All of the catechumens in the Diocese of Camden went to St. Agnes Church at Our Lady of Hope Parish to meet with Bishop Williams who added all of their names to the Book of the Elect. No longer catechumens, the Elect are sent back to their parishes to participate in the Scrutinies (celebrated on the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent). Each Scrutiny has the Elect look at (scrutinize) their own lives and ask for healing from all that is sinful and to ask for the Lord's grace to strengthen all that is good within them. All of the Scrutinies use the readings and the Gospel for Cycle A for Sundays (*Remember that the Church uses a 3-year cycle for readings on Sunday: A, B and C*). We're fortunate that this year is Cycle A so, no matter what Mass we attend, we'll be hearing all of the same readings and the same message of conversion. The Elect's journey ends on the Easter Vigil, the Saturday night before Easter Sunday, where the Elect will receive all of the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and Communion. It is my hope and prayer that each parishioner will be a part of this process one way or another and experience the wonder and awe of coming into the Catholic Church! Pray for our 3 Catechumens and all of the Catechumens of the Diocese of Camden as they take the next steps of their journey of faith!

The readings for the 3rd Sunday of Lent culminate with John's Gospel and the story of the woman at the well. Here's this week's list of Lenten Practices:

- 1. Ask: "What Am I Thirsting For?"** - Take 5 minutes and honestly name what you've been craving lately — rest? affirmation? distraction? control? Write it down. Bring it to prayer instead of pretending it's not there.
- 2. Pray with Your Real Story:** In prayer this week, don't sanitize your life. Tell God what's actually going on — the messy parts included.
- 3. Drink Before You Scroll:** Before reaching for your phone in the morning, pray one simple line: "Lord, give me living water today."
- 4. Have One Meaningful Conversation:** Initiate one real conversation this week — ask someone how they're really doing and stay present for the answer.
- 5. Let Go of an Old "Water Jar":** Identify one habit that keeps you stuck (doom-scrolling, gossip, avoidance) and intentionally loosen your grip on it.
- 6. Worship with Intention:** At Mass this Sunday, pick one moment (the Gospel, the Consecration, Communion) and give it your full attention — no autopilot.
- 7. Share What God Is Doing:** Share one small thing God is teaching you this Lent — with a friend, your family, or even in a journal. Faith grows when it's spoken.



Borrowed Belief to Personal Encounter

"We no longer believe because of what you said; for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the Savior of the world."

After meeting Jesus, the Samaritan woman went back and told others of her encounter with Jesus. Through her testimony the people of Samaria began their own faith journey, not depending on just her words but seeking out Jesus himself. They moved from a *borrowed belief* to a *personal encounter*. Many of us come to faith because of others, parents, teachers, friends. Their witness opens the door. But our own personal encounter begins when we step through the door and choose to know Jesus personally.

Today's gospel reminds us that evangelization is not about convincing alone, it's about *inviting an encounter*. Like the Samaritan woman, we are called to share our experiences of Christ openly and honestly, trusting that He will do the rest. When people truly meet Jesus, faith matures, and discipleship becomes a deliberate choice rather than a passive inheritance.

As we continue our journey, may we continually turn to Christ ourselves, listening and allowing our faith to deepen, so that others may come to know Him not only through us, but for themselves.



Come let us adore Christ as we walk through and contemplate the passion, suffering and death which redeemed us.


Come and join us Sunday, March 29, directly after the 11AM Mass for our annual Easter Egg Hunt!


