HOLY CHILD PARISH, RUNNEMEDE, NJ



Since the coordinated strikes from the United States and Israel against Iran began at the end of February, there has been, understandably so, a lot of attention garnered on America's interventions internationally, especially in conjunction with what occurred in Venezuela almost 2 months prior. Most of the rhetoric and opinions on the subject have fallen along partisan lines, framing America's actions abroad according to political ideologies and agendas. International response to the strikes has also been equally divided among allies to the US and rivals to US dominance. One voice that seems to have caught the world by surprise is that of Pope Leo XIV and the Holy See. Both online and in the media, there has been a tendency to create a polemic between the Vatican and the United States, mostly because it's much more sensational. The reality is far less dramatic.

As the Holy Roman Pontiff, the Pope is not just the pastor of the 1.422 billion baptized Catholics in the world, but the Vicar of Christ and the pastor of every soul on the face of the earth. The Vatican, the Holy See, the "Home Office", whatever you want to call it, the truth is what we're talking about is the Catholic Church, the Church that Christ intended to found, nothing more, nothing less. While the Vatican is considered a sovereign state (as well as permanent observer status in the United Nations), it's only so the Church can have formal relationships with countries throughout the world. When the Pope speaks, it's not a political statement. It's a statement from a moral voice that has only one agenda in mind - the Gospel. The Pope is not anti-American. Pope Leo doesn't speak that way because he dislikes American leadership. It's not that the Holy Father doesn't recognize the oppression that has occurred in Iran since the overthrow of the Shah in 1979. It's not that the Pope isn't aware of Iran's nuclear capabilities. It's because according to God, war is bad and the Church would be doing the world a disservice if she didn't speak out. In his Wednesday audience on May 14, 2025, Pope Leo spoke, *"Let us reject the Manichean notions so typical of that mindset of violence that divides the world into those who are good and those who are evil."*

In war, everyone loses, especially the innocent noncombatants who get caught in the crossfire. While it may be true that one side may be more concerned with protecting civilians more than others, any loss of life, even that of bad actors, is an assault against the dignity of human life. The taking of a life, considering the circumstances, may be morally permissible, but it is **never** acceptable. Pope Leo has spoken similarly in terms of the war in Gaza, Ukraine, Lebanon, Syria, Myanmar, Tigray and the Caucasus. The Pope's message hits hard because the Holy Father is being critical of our country. Since the 1st World War, America has seen herself in a moralistic sense - a country, cloaked in liberty and the unalienable rights of the individual, intervenes in the world to fight against tyranny and evil. We have always seen ourselves as the hero of the story. Unfortunately, life is much more complicated than it used to be, and things are not as clear cut as they appear.

As a Church, we are called to continue to pray for peace. As Pope Leo spoke this past Saturday, *"Prayer teaches us how to act. In prayer, our limited human possibilities are joined to the infinite possibilities of God. Thoughts, words and deeds then break the demonic cycle of evil and are placed at the service of the Kingdom of God. A Kingdom in which there is no sword, no drone, no vengeance, no trivialization of evil, no unjust profit, but only dignity, understanding and forgiveness."* May God continue to bless us, bless our country and bless our world! Our Lady, Queen of Peace, pray for us!

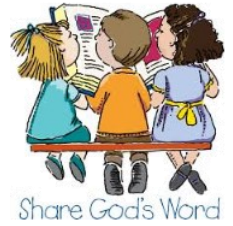

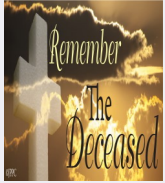

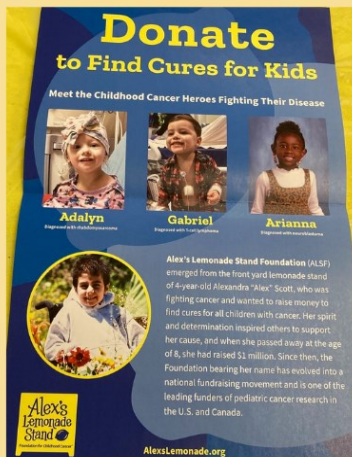
