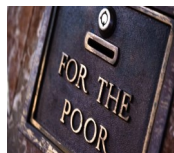

Truth be told, I don't actually remember receiving our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament at my First Holy Communion. In fact, I remember EVERYTHING ELSE surrounding that day 45 years ago. I remember my dark blue suit and my white shirt and tie. I remember the black prayer book and rosaries that I received. I remember that I got my first wristwatch from my parents, and I DEFINITELY remembered the reception at my house and all the cards and gifts that my twin brother and I received from both family and friends. While I know that I was only a kid, looking back, I lament the fact that I wasn't focused on the right thing. My family went to church every Sunday. My parents, especially my dad, were (and still are) very faith-filled. I went to a very good Catholic school and was properly catechized by my teachers and the Religious Teachers Filippini (the order of religious sisters in the parish at the time). Yet, for whatever reason, my heart and my focus were elsewhere. I just hope that as a Catholic, not just as a priest, I have grown and made the most of the 9000 or so opportunities that I've had to attend, serve and celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass since 1981. But even now, I know that I still can be distracted - still focusing on the wrong things, when I should be focused on our Lord. That's why this feast day, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, is so important. It's the Church reminding us that without our Lord, without the Eucharist, not only would we not have the Catholic Church, our lives would be devoid of nourishment. For the Blessed Sacrament is not a symbol. It is not symbolically the Body and Blood of Christ. It doesn't symbolically feed our starving souls. Holy Communion is and does everything we purport to believe. It's why Jesus says that His flesh is real food and His blood is true drink. Because we can't (and shouldn't) base our lives on a metaphor or a symbol. Our lives only make sense if the Real and True Presence of our Lord in the Eucharist is at the center of our lives. We are challenged, regardless of how many Masses we've been to or the times that we have had to receive our Lord, to make this Mass more than routine, but extraordinary! As St. Pio of Pietrelcina wrote, "*It is easier for the earth to exist without the sun than without the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass!*"

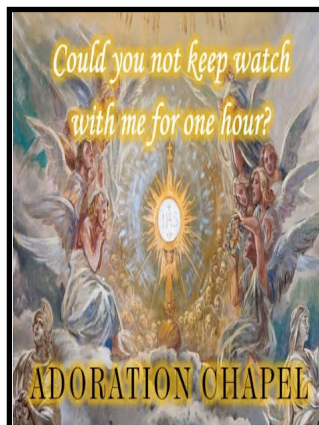

2026 National Eucharistic Pilgrimage processing through Camden Diocese June 12-14

In celebration of our nation's 250th birthday and as part of the continuing National Eucharistic Revival (2022–2025), the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage began on May 24, Pentecost Sunday, in St. Augustine, Florida, the site of the first Mass celebrated on American soil, and will conclude in Philadelphia on Fourth of July weekend. The theme of the pilgrimage is "One Nation Under God."

The pilgrimage will travel through 12 states and 18 dioceses, including our own Diocese of Camden, before arriving in Philadelphia for Independence Day weekend. This journey also coincides with the U.S. Bishops' consecration of our country to the Sacred Heart of Jesus on June 14.

Eucharistic Procession Route

Friday, June 12 - 7PM

**Mass & Eucharistic Procession
St. Mary's Parish in Gloucester City**

Join Bishop Williams at the oldest parish in our diocese, founded in by Bishop Kenrick of Philadelphia in 1848. The present church was built in 1888.

Eucharistic Procession will be short, just around the block that starts and ends at St. Mary's Church, then concluding the evening with Benediction.

National Consecration the U.S. to the Sacred Heart of Jesus ~ Friday, June 12, 7PM @ St Teresa Church

U.S. bishops will consecrate the country to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. All Catholics are encouraged to join the bishops in praying for the unity and healing of our country. In his encyclical, *Dilexit nos*, Pope Francis instructs us to "nourish our lives with the strength of the Eucharist" in Holy Communion and Adoration. In turn, parishes across the country are asked to collaboratively participate in 250 hours of adoration. Our parish will be hosting Adoration on Friday, June 12, for those unable to attend the Mass and Eucharistic Procession in Gloucester City that same night.

Saturday, June 13 – 8AM Check-in

9AM VITALity Mass & Way of St. James Eucharistic Procession in Ventnor City

Join us with the community of VITALity Catholic Healthcare Services. This is an intergenerational walk open to all and seniors are encouraged to attend with their loved ones! The full route roundtrip, commemorating "The Way of Saint James on the Road of Life," is 2.5 miles. If anyone needs a break along the route, there are benches on the boardwalk, and the church will remain open for those who can't participate in the walk. Lunch will be served after the procession but you must be registered to attend.

**Mass & Eucharistic Procession
Christ the King Parish in Haddonfield**

Historic Christ the King Parish was established in 1927. The New Jersey General Assembly met in Haddonfield during 1777, formally declaring the colony as an independent state that year. The procession will go down the town's main street and will conclude at Indian King Tavern Museum where the New Jersey legislature met during the American Revolution. There will be a closing Benediction at the museum before the pilgrimage continues to the Diocese of Paterson.

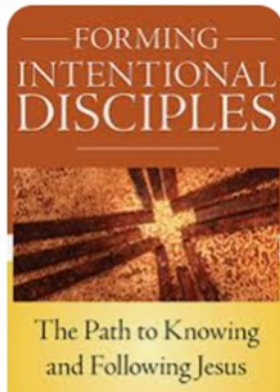


Eucharist, Pentecost, and Intentional Discipleship New Fall Book Club Starting

In today's Gospel, Jesus makes one of His most powerful declarations: *"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever."* Jesus is not simply offering wisdom or guidance; He is offering Himself. In the Eucharist, we receive His very Body and Blood and share in His divine life.

Last weekend, Pentecost reminded us that the Eucharist and the Holy Spirit are inseparable. The Spirit transformed the apostles from fearful followers into courageous disciples, sending them forth to share the Good News and invite others into a relationship with Christ.

That same Spirit is at work today. Over the past several months, twelve parishioners have gathered to pray, reflect, and discuss *Forming Intentional Disciples*. 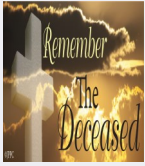
