Exiit qui seminat - The sower goes out to sow

As a part of making the Mass schedule, I try and give the priests every other Saturday off. The reason for doing so is twofold. First, it gives the priest an opportunity to have a little break before the hectic nature of the weekend. It allows us to possibly run errands and take care of other tasks

that could not be completed during the week. Secondly, if we do have a funeral or other function that comes in on a Saturday, the other priest is free and available to fill in where needed. For the most part, the Saturday schedule runs without a hitch. And then we have times like last Saturday when a squirrel wisely decided to chew through the power line attached to St. Maria Goretti and blow up the transformer in spectacular fash-



ion. Being without power by itself is an inconvenience. Being without power when there is Super Bingo borders on existential crisis. Due to a flurry of activity, some quick thinking and hard work from our wonderful volunteers and a \$50 power generator rental from Home Depot and crisis averted (free pizza along with the normal bingo fair didn't hurt either)! Plus PSE&G disposed of the deep-fried squirrel so I didn't have to. All in all, an interesting, tiring but good day!

So why am I talking anecdotally about an electrified squirrel and Super Bingo? It dawned on me that life rarely goes 100% according to plan. As my dear friend Sr. Dorothy Aloisio, FMIHM would often say, "We plan and God laughs!" The randomness of life, not to mention the cumulative effects of sin and death in the world, will catch us by surprise and quite easily throw a wrench into the works. How do we respond when things don't go as expected or even go horribly wrong? Do we let all of things that are out of our control affect our peace - the peace that Christ so readily demonstrates and gives? All three of the Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke) all have the account of Jesus being asleep in a boat during a violent storm. The disciples themselves are terrified. Jesus is at peace and awakens to the disciples' pleas to save them. The Lord calmly rebukes the winds and the waves, while at the same time, admonishes the group for their lack of faith. As Catholic Christians, we need to have Christ as the center of our lives. He steadies us regardless of what happens. When things and plans go awry, it is the same Christ who accompanies us in the chaos and will calm even the biggest of storms. In the midst of it all, our role is to not allow anything to rob us of our peace and our joy. This does not mean that every day will be rainbows and sunshine. It does not mean that we will super happy all of the time, even when everything around us is crashing down. Rather, it is the realization and the attitude that we do not face life alone. God is always with us and does not desire for us to be lost, but with Him. With His presence in our lives, we have the assurance of faith that regardless of what happens here on earth that heaven awaits. Except for the squirrel. He, pardon the pun, is cooked!

For example, we don't just 'read' from a textbook but use a variety of videos as well as hands on activities that help each of our students learn at their own pace without intimidation from peers. We have proven that placing children with disabilities within regular classrooms with the proper support allows them to learn their faith alongside their peers of the same age.


