21ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Exiit qui seminat - "The sower goes out to sow"



This week we're tackling the first of six principles inherent in the 2nd Vatican Council as described by Pope Leo XIV: the return to the primacy of Christ in proclamation. This concept was illuminated by Pope St. John Paul II in his Apostolic Exhortation, *Ecclesia in Asia*, given in November of 1999. It is the realization that Christ not only must be the focus of the preaching of the Gospel, but He is at the heart and the goal of evangelization. As St. Paul writes in his 2nd Letter to the Corinthians, "For we do not preach ourselves but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your slaves for the sake of Jesus" (2 Cor 4:5). Pope St. John Paul II speaks even more directly in saying that we can't evangelize without directly pointing towards our Lord: There can

be no true evangelization without the explicit proclamation of Jesus as Lord. The Second Vatican Council and the Magisterium since then, responding to a certain confusion about the true nature of the Church's mission, have repeatedly stressed the primacy of the proclamation of Jesus Christ in all evangelizing work. Thus Pope Paul VI explicitly wrote that "there is no true evangelization if the name, the teaching, the life, the promises, the Kingdom and the mystery of Jesus of Nazareth, the Son of God, are not proclaimed". This is what generations of Christians have done down the centuries. With understandable pride the Synod Fathers recalled that "many Christian communities in Asia have preserved their faith down the centuries against great odds and have clung to this spiritual heritage with heroic perseverance. For them to share this immense treasure is a matter of great joy and urgency" (Ecclesia in Asia 19). This urgency for a renewed commitment to proclaim Christ is not merely specific to the Church in a particular part of the world, but for the whole Church herself. But it is not our work alone. Pope Francis stated that we, as the Church, must offer ourselves generously to the work of evangelization and, at the same time, recognize that evangelization is first and foremost the Lord's work: In every activity of evangelization, the primacy always belongs to God, who has called us to cooperate with him and who leads us on by the power of his Spirit (**Evangelii gaudium** 12).

So what are the practical applications for us in returning to the primacy of Christ in proclamation? **First**, all of us are called to evangelize and give witness. While there is a private component to faith, our light is not meant to be kept under a bushel basket. We don't have to be "preachy" (writes the guy who preaches all the time) but live and love like Christ asks us to do. We should not be afraid to share our faith story and journey. You'd be amazed about how the Lord has touched the lives of those who see on a frequent basis. (If you want to share your story, I'd love to give you a way in which to do it. Come see me!) Second, the goal and center of everything that we do HAS to be Jesus, because it's His mission and plan anyway! We often can get distracted by other important motivations, many of which are related. We need more people to come to church! Nope. It has to be about Jesus. We want to see children and lots of young people and have a full school! Nope. It has to be about Jesus. We need to raise and make money! Important, but no. It has to be about Jesus. If we can shift our focus ever so slightly we can avoid the trap of confusing the activity, means and vehicle of evangelization with its true author and end, God Himself.

As we fulfill the mission entrusted to our care as members of Holy Child Parish, may we never lose sight that Christ is the center of our message, the source of our hope and the founda-

tion of our faith. All we say and do must point to Him, for it is only in

Christ that the world finds her salvation.

Some parishioners gave me some fresh vegetables from their garden, so I made some stuffed peppers and they were SO good!!!! Here's the recipe: https://feastandfarm.com/wprm print/classic-stuffed-peppers A couple of notes with the recipe: I used ground turkey instead of ground beef. Also when it says 1 cup of cooked rice, cook the rice first and take a cup of it. Don't do like I did and measure out a cup of uncooked rice, cook it, and then put it in the recipe. It was too much rice. Use whatever sauce you like (I used arrabiata) and I put a piece of scamorza (smoked mozzarella) on the top of each pepper before I put it in the oven. Enjoy!!!!



Preparing to Share the basis of our faith, the Lord and the Hope He provides

If we look at Jesus' life with his disciples, we see that He called twelve men simply to walk with Him—and in turn, He poured His life into theirs. Jesus taught not just by words, but by



example. Daily life became their classroom, and ordinary experiences became powerful lessons. His actions deeply shaped the spiritual growth and values of His disciples.

In the same way, everyone who shares the Catholic faith is a catechist. Parents, most especially, are their children's first catechists. Just as Jesus showed His disciples how to live, parents teach their children how to live the faith—through example, love, prayer, and daily witness. As St. John Paul II reminds us: "Every member of the faithful is called to holiness and mission. We are called to be Eucharist by word and action to our brothers and sisters in Christ."

This year's theme ..."Always be ready to give an explanation ... for a reason for your hope" (1 Peter 3:15) ... reminds us of the importance of sharing our faith and our hope in Christ with others.

On Catechetical Sunday, we honor all who teach the faith, but especially parents, whose role in forming their children is the most vital of all.
