22ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Exiit qui seminat - "The sower goes out to sow"



This week is the continuation of the 6 principles outlined by Pope Leo XIV of the Church's response to the 2nd Vatican Council: the missionary conversion of the entire Christian community. This concept refers to the call (and really obligation) of every member of the Church to be missionaries and embrace a missionary spirit. By virtue of our baptism we are called to go out to the whole world and proclaim the Good News - a part of what Pope St. John Paul II called the 'universal call to holiness' and crystalized in Pope Francis' concept of missionary discipleship. As missionary disciples, all baptized Christians are to live out their faith through their daily lives, focusing on an encounter with Jesus Christ and bearing wit-

ness to His love by sharing the Gospel with others in an accessible and attractive way. Just as our Lord did, we are to meet people where they are at the moment and accompany them in love to the place where God desires us all to go.

At his Sunday Angelus on July 15, 2018, Pope Francis spoke that the missionary zeal of the Church can be summed up in 2 points: the mission has a center and the mission has a face. As the Twelve go out two by two (Mark 6:7-13), we are shown that the center and end of missionary discipleship is Christ Himself. "[T]he going out and working of the Twelve appears to be radiating from a centre (sp), reaffirming the presence and work of Jesus in their missionary actions. This demonstrates that the Apostles have nothing of their own to proclaim, nor any abilities to manifest, but rather that they speak and act as 'emissaries', as messengers of Jesus." In giving witness to the Gospel of Christ, we recognize that our witness is not the initiative or work of individuals, or groups, or larger gatherings. It is the work of the Church with Christ as her center and head. The face of the mission is one of poverty and radical dependence. The Twelve bring only the bare basics in terms of possessions. It is God Himself who will provide all that we need. It allows the disciples to go out both unhampered and undistracted from the mission at hand.



While we often think of missionaries as people who go to foreign lands and preach the Gospel to the remote ends of the earth to those who have never heard the name of Jesus, that's only one dimension of missionary discipleship. One of our two patronesses, St. Thérèse of Lisieux, is the patron saint of foreign missions and never left her cloister! As a practical application to parish life, missionary zeal can be a lot more local. The reality is that the reach of priests and religious are limited. I am only one person and can only do so much in one day. I celebrate Mass for and with a specific group of the faithful who attend. I visit only so many parishioners as the hours of the day allow. The work of the Church is multiplied when the priest and the people work together. The faithful of the parish can go to places that I can't. We can preach and evangelize in our places of work, our schools, our homes, our teams, our hobbies and

activities that involve others, etc. Plus, this particular group of the People of God can let me know where I might be most needed. You make us aware of the sick, the elderly and those in need who need to have an encounter with Christ through the priest. In doing so, we give witness to Christ and may strike a chord in the heart of another who might be far away from our Lord and the Church and give them what they might need to return home again.

Let us remember that the work of the Spirit and the call to faith are not meant for individuals alone, but for whole households, whole communities, even entire nations who would one day be joined in one body, one baptism, one Lord. When the Christian community embraces the Gospel together, we bear witness to the power of God's grace to unite hearts and transform lives. May we, too, walk in that same spirit of renewal, keeping alive the flame of faith that was once kindled through the courage of missionaries, and may our lives together be a living testimony to Christ who gathers all into His fold.



Celebrating our Catechists' role in Faith Formation for our Parish

"Always be ready to give an explanation... for a reason for your hope." (1 Pet 3:15).

This year's National Catechetical theme reminds us of our calling to be witnesses of the faith and of the hope we have in Christ. Responding to this call, our catechists and aides have generously offered their time, talents, and hearts in service to our parish communities.

A Catechist is more than a teacher of the faith—they are someone who allows the Word of God to echo through their life. By example, they reflect the footprints of Jesus, sharing their faith and guiding students to live out the lessons of the Gospel each week.

Preparing to Share the basis of our faith, the Lord and the Hope He provides

If we look at Jesus' life with his disciples, we see that He called twelve men simply to walk with Him—and in turn, He poured His life into theirs. Jesus taught not just by words, but by



example. Daily life became their classroom, and ordinary experiences became powerful lessons. His actions deeply shaped the spiritual growth and values of His disciples.

In the same way, everyone who shares the Catholic faith is a catechist. Parents, most especially, are their children's first catechists. Just as Jesus showed His disciples how to live, parents teach their children how to live the faith—through example, love, prayer, and daily witness. As St. John Paul II reminds us: "Every member of the faithful is called to holiness and mission. We are called to be Eucharist by word and action to our brothers and sisters in Christ."

This year's theme ..."Always be ready to give an explanation ... for a reason for your hope" (1 Peter 3:15) ... reminds us of the importance of sharing our faith and our hope in Christ with others.

On Catechetical Sunday, we honor all who teach the faith, but especially parents, whose role in forming their children is the most vital of all.



St Theresa of Lisieux Novena

Starting September 22
"I will spend my Heaven doing good on Earth!"

St. Theresa loved nature. She felt she was like the simple wildflowers in the forest, blooming where God had planted her. She saw the world as God's garden and each person as representing a different kind of flower, each having the ability to enhance the world around them. St Theresa never saw herself as a rose but as a simple wildflower.

So, what did she mean by 'shower of roses? 'She loved roses and as a child, she would toss rose petals towards the Blessed Sacrament. When she was dying, she was able to look out the window at the rose bushes that were blooming. She believed her mission was just the beginning and explained, "After my death, I will let fall, a shower of roses. I will spend my heaven doing good upon earth. I will raise up a mighty host of little saints. My mission is to make God loved."
