

CHURCH SCHOOL AND YOUTH MINISTRIES

Lesson of the Day

Lower School: Exile and Return Upper School: The Prophet Ezekiel

Preschool - Rm 221 (age 3 to Kindergarten)

Before Christmas we spend several weeks meditating on what it meant for God's people to come into God's presence via the Ark of the Covenant in both the Tent and the Temple. This week we will explore how the Israelites discovered the fullness of God's presence during their exile, the destruction of the Temple and the loss of the Ark. During this time, God's people discovered God wasn't in just one place but God's presence was everywhere.

Lower Elementary - Rm 215 (grades 1 to 3)

Israel's identity was closely tied to the notion that the presence of God was found in the Ark of the Covenant. The Ark was first placed in the Tent and followed them as they wandered in the desert and eventually came to rest in the Temple that Solomon built. But, just as the Prophets said it would happen, Israel lost the Ark and the Temple was destroyed. Today we will think about how Israel's understanding of God's presence shifted after the destruction of the Temple.

Upper School - Rm 217 (grades 4 thru 7)

The Prophets of God often carried with them heavy messages for God's people. But even in the midst of all the heaviness, they also proclaimed God's love and hope to God's people. This week we will open those Bibles to the Book of Ezekiel. We will hear how God spoke to the Prophet Ezekiel through visions that he then shared with God's people and called them to turn back to God. Specifically, we will focus on Ezekiel's vision of the valley of dry bones and the hope this vision held.

Confirmation - Hospitality Suite

In this Sunday's class we will discuss what it means to have the freedom and responsibility to make our own choices. Please plan to be here for an extended class next Sunday, 1/22 (running from 10:45 - 12pm). Rev. Winnie will review several themes from the fall and we will have a conversation more broadly about the significance of confirmation. We will also run through the service in the church, so your attendance is important!
