#### CHURCH SCHOOL AND YOUTH MINISTRIES

#### Preschool/Lower Elementary - Rm 221 (age 3 to grade 3)

Our story this Sunday will be about Jesus's baptism. We will wonder together what it must have been like to hear John the Baptist tell everyone to live differently and what that meant for the people living in Jesus's time.

#### **DID YOU KNOW**



Did you know, as a thought for consideration for your 2024 Stewardship pledge, 25% of all Stewardship gifts are made by online giving? These online gifts are an easy way for parishioners to fulfill their pledges. They are also a predictable way for Redeemer to budget for cash flow, and save on the staff time to process checks, cash and stocks. Credit card companies charge Redeemer about 3% of each transaction and banks charge a little over 1% for the automated deductions (ACH). Although these fees

are not significant, they do add up. So, taking into consideration all factors of cost and time, the most efficient, and helpful way of online giving, is to set up automatic deductions from a bank account.
