Remember to move your clocks (the old fashioned ones) BACK by an hour before you go to bed next Saturday. Daylight Saving Time ends November 2.


# Fall Churchyard Day

#### **DID YOU KNOW**

Did you know Charlie Merwin, Rector's Warden and Stewardship Committee member, addressed both services this past Sunday with a thoughtful message about the Redeemer's

Stewardship? "We sent our first Stewardship appeal and hope that you'll open it and consider a pledge for the year ahead. It is quite a year, 2026, the 175<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Church of the Redeemer. 1851 – now 2026 – in another 175 years it will be 2201.

Those spans of time aren't sustained by fund raising events, or capital campaigns. Getting through the past 175 years, and to 2201, is a journey with no easily-seen tangible goals or accomplishments.

Think about the charity of the men and women of 1851, and 1861, and 1901, 1941, 2001. Their names are all but forgotten and we don't hear their tinkling cymbals or sounding brass of their gifts to Redeemer.

Instead the residue of their charity are these stone walls that wouldn't burn down. It's the hard pews we're sitting on. It's generations of Prayer Books and Hymnals that fall apart and have to be replaced. It's lightbulbs, and regularly repointed masonry, and cleaning and pruning.....
The quiet eternal accounting of Christian charity.

In an anniversary year, like any year, we ask you to consider that accounting - your

pledge - and what it means to the men and women of 2035, 2055 and even 2201. Consider your pledge, and perhaps an increase to
