CHURCH SCHOOL AND YOUTH MINISTRIES

Lesson for the Day Adam and Eve

Preschool - Rm 221 (age 3 to Kindergarten)

This week we dive into the Second Creation narrative and hear about Adam and Eve. Specifically we hear how they "fell apart" from God, each other, God's creation and the image of God in their deep selves.

Lower Elementary - Rm 215 (grades 1 to 3)

Today we reflect on the ways Adam and Eve's choices effected their connection with God and each other and all of creation. The choices they made and we now make have consequences. We will reflect on the ways in which our choices impact our ability to connect with God, others and creation.

Upper Elementary-Rm 217 (grades 4 thru 7)Building on last week's introduction to the Noah narrative, the children will explore the God's frustration with human sinfulness and the cleansing power of the floodwaters. We will also reflect on the floodwaters in light of our own Baptism. Note Well - Our 4th/5th grade class and 6th/7th grade class will meet together in Room 217.

Confirmation-Youth Cottage

This week our Confirmation class will continue their testing of the Nicene Creed. Do we believe all that the Creed affirms? What objections do we have? Is that a problem? Should it be? Join us as we deliberate upon the Creed together.
