
Help make Christmas special for the OST (Out of School Time) children

CHURCH SCHOOL AND YOUTH MINISTRIES

Note: Starting in two weeks, on Sunday December 4, Upper School will be preparing for their Christmas pageant to be presented during coffee hour in the Assembly Room on Sunday, December 18. These in class preparations and rehearsals are an important part of making sure everyone is ready to perform on December 18. We want everyone to feel prepared and ready to share the Good News with the congregation!

Lesson of the Day Lower School: The Prophets Upper School: God's People in Exile

Preschool - Rm 221 (age 3 to Kindergarten)

In preparation for the beginning of Advent next week, we will explore the role the prophets played within the life of Israel. Specifically, we will look at the ways in which the prophets foretold the coming of the Messiah.

Lower Elementary - Rm 215 (grades 1 to 3)

All throughout this year, we have explored the ways in which God has always been with the people of God. But the people of God have not always been with God. This week we begin to explore the role prophets played in the life of Israel. The prophets' job was to show the people, king and priests when they turned away from God.

Upper School - Rm 217 (grades 4 thru 7)

Over the past several weeks we have meditated on what it meant for God's people to come into God's presence via the Ark of the Covenant in both the Tent and the Temple. This week we will explore how the Israelites discovered the fullness of God's presence during their exile, the destruction of the Temple and the loss of the Ark. During this time, God's people discovered God wasn't in just one place but God's presence was everywhere.

Confirmation - Hospitality Suite

The Confirmation class will have a discussion about the Sacraments: The seven sacraments are baptism, confirmation, Eucharist, penance, anointing of the sick, marriage and holy orders. They are divided into three categories: sacraments of initiation, sacraments of healing and sacraments of service.

Redeemer Youth Group - Youth Cottage

RYG, will be meeting this Sunday from 4–6 pm. We will start with basketball at a nearby park and will finish up with dinner and conversation in the cottage. Please join us as we discuss the many blessings of Thanksgiving, and the role such a feast day has played in other cultures and religions over the centuries.
