#### **CHURCH SCHOOL AND YOUTH MINISTRIES**

#### Preschool/Lower Elementary - Rm 221 (age 3 to grade 3)

This week we will hear the stories of Jesus's closest companions, the twelve disciples. We will hear who they were, what they did, and what they are best known for.

#### Upper Elementary - Rm 217 (grades 4 thru 5)

John's Gospel presents Jesus in a unique way, and in Sunday's class we will learn more about that. In particular we will talk about John the Baptist and the way he understood Jesus's divinity before most other people.

#### Middle School - Hospitality Suite (grades 6 thru 8)

We will split the class into two groups from now until January so that 8th graders can focus on their upcoming decision to be confirmed. On Sunday, 6th and 7th graders will talk about saints and 8th graders will begin studying the Nicene Creed.

#### **DID YOU KNOW**

Did you know the Stewardship Committee had an informative Adult Forum last Sunday to highlight the importance of our collective Stewardship for the fiscal stability of the Church, explain trends, graphically show the importance of our collective giving and statistically explain the value of each and every gift. Graph One shows a breakdown of gifts into 5 different ranges, with each range being an equal portion of the overall Stewardship 2023 dollars raised. Graph two shows the correlating number of donors in each slice of the Graph One's pie.

These graphs demonstrate the impact of every gift, and also visually show we are fortunate to have a broad base and not rely on a select few larger gifts. Every pledge makes a difference. Thank you to those who have already committed to Stewardship 2024.
