### CHURCH SCHOOL AND YOUTH TAKE A BREAK AND RESUME JANUARY 7

**Church School** is offered for children ages 3 through 8th grade on most Sundays during the school year following the 9:30am service. The youngest children follow the Godly Play curriculum, which encourages learning through wondering. We recount biblical stories and come to understand them by asking questions together. Our upper elementary classes are more discussion and activity-based. Middle Schoolers meet together in preparation for the rite of Confirmation, offered for students in grade 8 and above. Our middle school curriculum helps students understand their faith in the context of their own lives and the world, weaving lessons together from bible stories, church history, and real-life experience.

Children are also invited to attend Children's Chapel, which takes place on Sunday mornings during the 9:30am service. Children follow the crucifer into the chapel after the Gospel reading and return during the Peace. In Chapel we might discuss the lessons for the day, the liturgical season, or upcoming holidays.

The Redeemer Youth Group, RYG, is a high school youth group comprised of kids from all over the main line, including many Redeemer kids as well as their friends and peers from other churches or no church background at all. RYG is ecumenical and peers from other churches or no church background at all.
