From the Rector

In Matthew's account of Jesus' birth, he includes the appearance of a star in the night sky that led the wisemen to the place where Jesus was. The story usually culminates with our focus on their presentation of gifts, things brought for a king. What is less imagined, is the star's signifying that Jesus' birth had cosmic significance. Stars were considered eternal in their constancy. And so this star made Jesus' birth timeless; he somehow, mysteriously, transcended the noise of all the crowded busyness that surrounded him.

Imagine a night sky without stars. The darkness would be consuming and we'd be left without direction. Spend a few moments, late in the night, to appreciate the stars anew. Who could we be without them?

The same holds for the Gospel. Imagine life spent without a deep and full sense of grace and joy, of empathy and communion and promise. Imagine everything coming to nothing. Compare this with all things being brought to their fulfillment in God's eternity. Imagine that light.

The church is meant to be a constant witness to this brightness. It is meant to illumine all that is beautiful and good and true and timeless, and, in the most important of ways, it is meant to transcend the noise that so surrounds us now, so that we can find our way from conflict to peace. This witness is what we, at The Redeemer, embody and practice not just at a holiday but throughout the year and across generations. Imagine a world without churches. Who would we be without them?

Churchyard Lanterns

Every year the Redeemer Youth Group (RYG) places lanterns on graves throughout the churchyard. It is a precious exercise in remembering the deep and abiding history of our church and community, here and across the world. It also gives us an opportunity to appreciate that even death cannot divide us from God's love or from one another. As we celebrate this Christmas, we do it with all those who came before us; with the hope of reunion and the promise of the resurrection. As you make your way to and from church on Christmas Eve we hope you will pause, as we did, and take in the lights of those who now shine elsewhere.

The Redeemer Youth Group RYG, has had a busy fall! RYG meets every Sunday from 4-6 pm in the Parish house and has grown into a very sizable group representing over a dozen schools from the Main Line and surrounding areas. We have a strong leadership team committed to helping this diverse collection of kids as they navigate the tricky years of high school. RYG hopes to cultivate a "third" space, away from home and school, where kids can do the work of truly discerning what kind of person they want to become, as well as beginning to consider the role that faith and community can play in contributing to the development of our best selves. Once a month we go down to the Kensington neighborhood of Philadelphia and serve the community of St. Francis Inn. This has become a highly competitive group to get into and so we have added 6 more Sundays for the remainder of the school year. Additionally last year the kids requested a morning Bible study. Bible Breakfast meets every Thursday morning from 7:15-8am. Some mornings we are standing room only in the Library and are considering moving into a larger space. This January we will have our annual fundraising square dance to raise funds for our trip to DC to serve the urban community of our nations capitol. This event is entirely produced by our teenagers. They cook, they serve, they dance! It is a wonderful opportunity for the kids to come together as a team as we prepare for our trip over Presidents Day Weekend. It is also a wonderful opportunity for them to serve our Redeemer community as it has served them so well over the years. Please find the invitation here in The News and come witness for yourselves the transformation of our Burns Hall into a festive Country Square Dance. It has been over a decade since I have been involved in the Redeemer Youth Group. This population continues to amaze me, truly. Not only are they remarkably smart and motivated young adults, but they are loving, compassionate and committed to using their bodies, their minds, and their lives to make their communities and this world a better place. Christmas for many is a time of hope, and every year I am astounded at the hope and gratitude I feel for this population as they clamor for roles in the Pageant, get themselves to Bible Breakfast during peek academic stress, and consider why the birth of this baby Jesus changed the world. I believe teenagers are the gateway to the next chapter of our story, and in a season of great darkness I believe they are our light.
