Dr. Philip Cary, Professor of Philosophy at Eastern University

The core tenets of the Incarnation – the doctrine which underlies the faith of the Church – are already professed by churchgoers on a regular basis. This is because the doctrine of the Incarnation is on full display in the Nicene Creed. Dr. Philip Cary joins us this morning as he unpacks the Incarnation through the lens of the Creed and addresses some of the typical questions that people have about the doctrine and its role in Christian life, faith, and worship. Phil Cary is Professor of Philosophy at Eastern University and Editor-in-chief of *Pro Ecclesia: A Journal of Catholic and Evangelical*.



CHURCH SCHOOL AND YOUTH MINISTRIES

Lesson for the Day Geography of Israel

Preschool - Rm 221 (age 3 to Kindergarten)

Today we will learn about the geography of Israel using a globe and puzzle map. Why geography in Church School? Touching and seeing these objects helps children discover that Jesus was a real person who lived at a particular time in a particular place.

Lower Elementary - Rm 215 (grades 1 to 3)

Using a raised surface map of Israel, we will begin to tie the geography of Jesus' life to Scripture. We will begin by identifying the towns of Nazareth and Bethlehem. By pinpointing the actual places in the Christmas story, the children are able to understand that Jesus isn't made up, but rather a real person who lived and breathed in places that exist today.

Upper Elementary/middle school - Rm 217 (grades 4 thru 7)

Today the older kids will be learning the Nativity story by rehearsing the Church School Christmas Pageant, to be presented on December 19. There will also be costuming, creation of art work for the program, and other tasks to be organized by the teachers. Everyone – whether able to participate in the pageant or not – has a part!

Confirmation-Youth Cottage

Our confirmands will spend this week exploring the Episcopal Church's favorite book, The Book of Common Prayer! The students will learn how the words, prayers, and services within the book influence our practices and identities as Episcopalians.

RYG will be meeting this Sunday at the cottage from 4-6 pm. We will have some outside games and then will move inside to talk about advent and fundraising for our winter work trip. Please join us!
