

#### Lesson for the Day

Exodus from Egypt

#### Preschool - Rm 221 (age 3 to Kindergarten)

This week we move from the book of Genesis to Exodus. We will hear how God was with the people as they moved from slavery to freedom through water. The People of God have often looked back on this narrative to sustain them when they feel lost or feel God is hidden from them.

#### Lower Elementary - Rm 215 (grades 1 to 3)

Today the children will explore the ways in which the memory of the exodus from Egypt is preserved through the traditions of Passover and the Eucharist.

#### Upper Elementary/middle school - Rm 217 (grades 4 thru 7)

We will continue our study of the Exodus narrative. Today the children will explore the ways in which the memory of the exodus from Egypt is preserved through the traditions of Passover.
