Love to cook? Perfect! Sign up to make a meal!



#### Lesson of the Day The Season of Lent

#### Preschool - Rm 221 (age 3 to Kindergarten)

We invite the children to help "Bury the Alleluia." The catechists and children will decorate an "Alleluia" banner and then put it away until Easter. This is one small way of acquainting the children with the custom of not speaking or singing "Alleluia" during Lent.

## Lower Elementary - Rm 215 (grades 1 to 3)

This week the children will explore Lent as the season when we prepare for Easter. Lent is a solemn time of reflection in which we explore both the limits of our humanity and the greatness of Christ's sacrifice. Together we will explore ways in which Lent prepares us to remember the Mystery of Easter.

#### Upper School - Rm 217 (grades 4 thru 7)

Today we will spend the morning exploring the significance of Lent within the Church calendar and our own lives. Specifically we will examine how we can use the 6 weeks of Lent to prepare us to embrace the Mystery of Easter.

We will meet this week and discuss outreach programs at Redeemer as we continue figuring out what our service project will be!
