
Evaluate Grant Applications

CHURCH SCHOOL AND YOUTH MINISTRIES

Lesson for the Day

The Ten Commandments

Preschool - Rm 221 (age 3 to Kindergarten)

Building on last week's story of the Exodus of God's People from Egypt, this week we will ask the question: "Now that the people are free...how will they live? What is the best way?" We will hear God's loving answer by exploring the 10 best ways (commandments) to love God and love people.

Lower Elementary - Rm 215 (grades 1 to 3)

Today we will think about the why behind God giving God's people the 10 best ways or commandments. Did God give the Israelites the commandments out of anger or love? What would life be like if God had never given them and us the commandments.

Upper Elementary/middle school - Rm 217 (grades 4 thru 7)

Today we will continue the study of the Life of Moses and the Exodus from the Book of Exodus. Among the important texts of the Torah or Pentateuch (first five books of the Bible), one of the most well-known contains the Decalogue (meaning "ten words"). After God liberated the Israelites from Egypt, they needed a pathway that a free people could follow in order to live in God's presence so the Lord, through Moses, gave them the Ten Commandments. Today our children will reflect on the meaning and familiarity of these commandments and perhaps write some in their own words.

Confirmation-Youth Cottage

This week our confirmands will regroup and begin their journey into post-Confirmation life. They'll continue brainstorming and discerning how they are called to serve The Redeemer community and the wider community. The second half of this academic year is devoted to the planning and execution of their group service project.

RYG will be meeting this Sunday from 4-6 pm in the cottage. We will start with some outside activity and continue inside with our conversation on society's influence on the development of identity. Please join us!
