#### Sunday, March 12



#### **DID YOU KNOW**

Did you know, when Interfaith Hospitality Network comes to Redeemer in a few weeks it will really be the first time since pre-covid, and since the New Parish House was built, to host these families? There was a brief stay with only one family for two nights in October. To help manage the re-establishment of hosting the families, after nearly three years, and a transition of volunteer leadership within Redeemer, a "Kitchen Cabinet" was created to lead the program. Now we have several Redeemer members, working in conjunction, and with support from staff, to figure out how to use the new space and to best accommodate the families. There have been a lot of upgrades with a wonderful kitchen, new bathrooms with showers and a downstairs community space. It is because of the dedication of many in our community to host these homeless families in transition, and it will also be a learning, and growing, process for Redeemer members to make their stay as welcoming and comfortable as possible.

#### **CHURCH SCHOOL AND YOUTH MINISTRIES**

#### **Lesson of the Day**

Lower School: Parable of the Grain of Wheat Upper School: The Season of Lent

#### Preschool - Rm 221 (age 3 to Kindergarten)

Last week we began our exploration of the reason and rhythm of Lent. Today we will continue that discussion by exploring the parable of the Grain of Wheat (John 12:24). We will talk about how seeds transform to become great stalks of wheat. We will reflect on this parable and the connection between it and Jesus' death and resurrection.

#### Lower Elementary - Rm 215 (grades 1 to 3)

This week the children will explore the Parable of the Grain of Wheat (John 12:24). Looking at hard seeds and stalks of wheat that have grown from the seeds, the children will be invited to wonder about the story Jesus told: A grain of wheat is planted, and it dies. Unless it falls into the ground and dies, it remains a single seed. But if it dies, it becomes a whole new creation and bears much fruit. Reflecting on this parable will lead to a conversation about Jesus and his need to die in order to bear fruit, the great fruit of resurrection.

#### Upper School - Rm 217 (grades 4 thru 7)

Today we will spend the morning exploring the significance of Lent within the Church calendar and our own lives. Specifically we will examine how we can use the 6 weeks of Lent to prepare us to embrace the Mystery of Easter.
