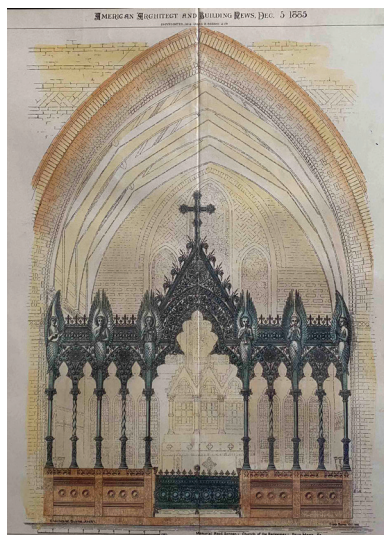

DID YOU KNOW



Did You Know the metal screen on a stone base in Room 125 of the Parish House was designed by church architect Charles M. Burns, Jr. at the request of Mrs. Charles Wheeler as a memorial honoring her husband? Mr. Wheeler, a vestryman and member of the building committee, worked closely with Burns on the church project. He commissioned Burns to design the east window over the altar to honor deceased members of his family. When Wheeler died suddenly in August 1883, his widow asked Burns to design not only his headstone (the oversize Celtic cross on the south side of the church) and also a decorative metal screen to visually separate the chancel from the nave. The screen, topped with a cross, also known as a rood, was to be in “dialogue” with the Wheeler memorial east window and Burns produced a dramatic tour de force of intertwined copper, brass and wrought iron punctuated with rock crystal, agate and onyx. The screen has been described

as “one of the most elaborate pieces of metal-work ever made in the country.” You can admire the craftsmanship and details of the screen in Room 125 in the new Parish House. CHURCH SCHOOL AND YOUTH MINISTRIES

Lesson for the Day

The Resurrection

Preschool - Rm 221 (age 3 to Kindergarten)

The resurrection of Jesus is the bedrock of our faith. Using 3D materials we'll explore the Gospel story of the Empty Tomb, celebrate the Good News of the resurrection and wonder together over this great mystery within its historical context.

Lower Elementary - Rm 215 (grades 1 to 3)

Using a variety of materials, we'll explore what is known as the Mystery of our Faith: "Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again." We'll also prepare to celebrate Christ's resurrection next Sunday by introducing our model of the empty tomb.

Upper Elementary/middle school - Rm 217 (grades 4 thru 7)

In preparation for Easter Sunday, we will spend the morning exploring the miracle of Christ's resurrection. Specifically, we will focus on Christ's resurrection not merely as a defeat of death, but as an invitation to us to fully participate in the Kingdom of God.
