Seeing All Things Through the Generosity of Faith

Ask anyone who is not a Christian for a word that describes the Christian faith; "generosity" would probably not be mentioned. Ask anyone who is a member of a church for a word that describes the church's core message, "generosity" probably wouldn't be included. Faith is often described as the discipline of pinching our lives down to a level of moral thinness that would allow us to squeeze through "the narrow gate." This stinginess does not reflect the Gospels nor the expression of faith set out in our worship. Yet we regularly fail to appreciate that faith is our cultivation of seeing God's generosity in all things. In a series of investigations of what is said and done in our liturgies and what is taught by the church, we will explore how it is that generosity is expressive of the very heart of Christianity.

DID YOU KNOW



Did you know mostbaptismal fonts have eight sides? The number eight is very important biblically because it signifies new beginnings. On the eighth day, after creation and after the Sabbath (the day or rest), God returned to work which was the first new beginning. And, by Jesus rising on the eighth day or the day after the Sabbath, Saint Augustine described the eighth day as "everlasting....hallowed by the resurrection in Christ." The octagonal baptismal font represents the importance of a new beginning as we welcome into the life of the Holy Spirit all who are baptized. Interestingly, Redeemer's font does not have eight sides.

CHURCH SCHOOL AND YOUTH MINISTRIES

Lesson of the Day Lower School: Jesus' Resurrection Upper School: Parables of Hospitality and Invitation

Preschool - Rm 221 (age 3 to Kindergarten)

The resurrection of Jesus is the bedrock of our faith. Using 3D materials we'll explore the Gospel story of the Empty Tomb, celebrate the Good News of the resurrection and wonder together over this great mystery within its historical context.

Lower Elementary - Rm 215 (grades 1 to 3)

Using a variety of materials, we'll explore what is known as the Mystery of our Faith: "Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again." We'll also reflect on the role of the Eucharist in light of Christ's resurrection.

Upper School - Rm 217 (grades 4 thru 7)

Many of the parables Jesus told are better understood in the light of the events of Holy Week and Easter. The parables we hear this morning are a prime example of this. Today the kids will look at three separate parables Jesus told about banquets. We will explore the relationship between the Eucharist and Christ's resurrection.

Confirmation - Hospitality Suite

The class meets weekly after the 9:30 service in the Hospitality Suite and is currently working on a special project.

Redeemer Youth Group - Youth Cottage

RYG will be meeting this Sunday from 4-6 pm and will be considering the resurrection and its impact on their lives in 2023. We will also be preparing for our fundraiser on April 28th. Please come!
