Seeing All Things Through the Generosity of Faith

Ask anyone who is not a Christian for a word that describes the Christian faith; "generosity" would probably not be mentioned. Ask anyone who is a member of a church for a word that describes the church's core message, "generosity" probably wouldn't be included. Faith is often described as the discipline of pinching our lives down to a level of moral thinness that would allow us to squeeze through "the narrow gate." This stinginess does not reflect the Gospels nor the expression of faith set out in our worship. Yet we regularly fail to appreciate that faith is our cultivation of seeing God's generosity in all things. In a series of investigations of what is said and done in our liturgies and what is taught by the church, we will explore how it is that generosity is expressive of the very heart of Christianity.

Now that temperatures dictate closet reorganization, the Outreach Community Services Committee has made contact with the **Ukrainian Cathedral** in Philadelphia, which collects donations for refugees, people like us, who had to flee their native land with literally the clothes on their backs. A gray hamper in the Parish House hallway is marked for **clean, gently used** contributions (no holes or tears) to this cause. Drop off clothing between **Sundays, April 23 and 30**. Volunteers will drive the items over to the Cathedral in the Northeast, where they will be gratefully received & distributed. DID YOU KNOW



Did you know Redeemer's involvement with African Children's Mission (ACM) is almost 20 years old? ACM was started in 2004 by Gary Hall, who was our Rector at the time. He wanted to extend Redeemer's Outreach to help with the AIDS crisis in Africa. At the initial meeting, which coincided with a snow storm, over thirty people showed up. Redeemer chose Malawi because it is one of the poorest countries in the heart of Africa. We have continued to support the health care in various villages in Malawi, at first through helping

children who were orphaned by AIDS and recently with COVID. Over the years, as treatment, and education around AIDS improved, Redeemer continued to support health care and education in Malawi. Redeemer has sent several missions, with over thirty members, traveling to Malawi, and there are plans for another mission next year. ACM works with Global Aids Interfaith Alliance, now called GAIA Healthcare, to assist with programs and to effectively make an impact in Malawi.


Livestream Failure

CHURCH SCHOOL AND YOUTH MINISTRIES

Lesson of the Day

Lower School: The Pearl of Great Price Upper School: Parables of Joyful Finding

Preschool - Rm 221 (age 3 to Kindergarten)

Today we will hear the Parable of the Pearl of Great Price. We will wonder what Jesus meant when he called the Kingdom of Heaven a pearl and what it means to think of the Kingdom of Heaven as being of such great value that it surpasses all else.

Lower Elementary - Rm 215 (grades 1 to 3)

We are spending Eastertide exploring the parables Jesus told about the Kingdom of Heaven. Today we will hear the Parable of the Pearl of Great Price. This parable asks what about the Kingdom of Heaven is so great that Jesus was willing to make such a great sacrifice.

Upper School - Rm 217 (grades 4 thru 7)

Today the older children will hear two different parables about something being lost and then found: The Lost Sheep and The Lost Coin. They will reflect on what these two parables have to tell us about God's persistent love for us and God's joy in welcoming us into community.

Confirmation - Hospitality Suite

The class meets weekly after the 9:30 service in the Hospitality Suite and is currently working on a special project.

Redeemer Youth Group - Youth Cottage

RYG will be meeting early this Sunday at 3 pm. We will caravan over to Chanticleer gardens and will discuss the importance of Environmental Theology while reveling in natures wonders. We plan to be back to the cottage by 5:15 pm. Please join us!
