Seeing All Things Through the Generosity of Faith

Wednesdays: 7:00 - 8pm

Masterman Hall: led by Peter Vanderveen

Ask anyone who is not a Christian for a word that describes the Christian faith; "generosity" would probably not be mentioned. Ask anyone who is a member of a church for a word that describes the church's core message, "generosity" probably wouldn't be included. Faith is often described as the discipline of pinching our lives down to a level of moral thinness that would allow us to squeeze through "the narrow gate." This stinginess does not reflect the Gospels nor the expression of faith set out in our worship. Yet we regularly fail to appreciate that faith is our cultivation of seeing God's generosity in all things. In a series of investigations of what is said and done in our liturgies and what is taught by the church, we will explore how it is that generosity is expressive of the very heart of Christianity.

Winter-Spring-Summer Clothing Needed

for Ukrainian Refugees - Sunday, April 23 thru 30

Now that temperatures dictate closet reorganization, the Outreach Community Services Committee has made contact with the **Ukrainian Cathedral** in Philadelphia, which collects donations for refugees, people like us, who had to flee their native land with literally the clothes on their backs. A gray hamper in the Parish House hallway is marked for **clean, gently used** contributions (no holes or tears) to this cause. Drop off clothing between **Sundays, April 23 and 30**. Volunteers will drive the items over to the Cathedral in the Northeast, where they will be gratefully received & distributed. DID YOU KNOW

Did you know 25% of all Stewardship gifts are made by online giving? These online gifts are an easy way for parishioners to fulfill their pledges. They are also a predictable way for Redeemer to budget for cash flow, and save on the staff time to process checks, cash and stocks. Credit card companies charge Redeemer about 3% of each transaction and banks charge a little over 1% for the automated deductions (ACH). Although these fees are not significant, they do add up. So, taking into consideration all factors of cost and time, the most efficient, and helpful way of online giving, is to set up automatic deductions from a bank account.



CHURCH SCHOOL AND YOUTH MINISTRIES

Lesson of the Day

Lower School: Parable of the Sower Upper School: Parable of the Prodigal Son

Preschool - Rm 221 (age 3 to Kindergarten)

Today we will hear the Parable of the Sower. We will wonder about what it takes for a seed to grow and thrive: sun, water and the right soil! We will then talk about what this parable might have to tell us about the Kingdom of God.

Lower Elementary - Rm 215 (grades 1 to 3)

Jesus told the crowds many parables, sometimes using the image of a sower. He began one parable by saying: "Listen! A sower went out to sow." Then he described how some seeds fell on the path and were quickly eaten by birds, other seeds fell on rocky ground and withered, other seeds fell among thorns and were choked, and other seeds fell on good soil and brought forth grain. We'll talk about this parable and what it might tell us about the Kingdom of God.

Upper School - Rm 217 (grades 4 thru 7)

Today we will explore another lost and found parable, the Parable of the Loving Father (Luke 15:11-32). Also known as the Parable of the Prodigal Son, we'll hear about the brother who left home, squandered his inheritance, realized his huge mistake and returned to the loving, celebratory arms of his father. We'll talk about how God accepts us as we are; we need only to come to him and ask.

Confirmation - Hospitality Suite

The class meets weekly after the 9:30 service in the Hospitality Suite and is currently working on a special project.
