

DID YOU KNOW

Did you know the extent of the collaborative effort it takes to publish the liturgies for the services? Each week, there is a liturgy planning meeting where the following week's preacher chooses, based on the season, which lesson to read. There is a Google Sheet set up where the liturgy, prayers, psalms, lesson and gospel are filled in and Michael Diorio fills in the music, anthem texts and Music Notes. Ken Garner then takes the information from Google and turns it into a Word document, cutting and pasting the Scripture readings from a website and software for each portion of the service. Ken then edits the text for the correct fonts, and boldness, and uploads everything to a desktop publishing software where he formats it for a service sheet. The draft is presented for approval at the following week's liturgical planning meeting. The service sheets are printed first and then folded by a very noisy machine. A dedicated team of volunteers gather every Friday afternoon to stuff the inserts into the program. All this work enables parishioners to be present with the order of the service to free their worship. And yes, the programs are recycled after the service!

CHURCH SCHOOL AND YOUTH MINISTRIES

Lesson for the Day THE CALL OF SAMUEL

Preschool - Rm 221 (age 3 to Kindergarten)

The Bible is full of stories of grown-ups. It's rare to find stories of children, let alone children who are named. Today we will hear the story of a boy named Samuel, who would one day grow to become a prophet and judge.

Lower Elementary - Rm 215 (grades 1 to 3)

We return to the Old Testament today to hear the story of Samuel. A boy dedicated to God before his birth, he spent his childhood shadowing priests and would one day anoint the first two Kings of Israel. But today, we focus on God's calling out to Samuel when he was still just a boy.

Upper Elementary/middle school - Rm 217 (grades 4 thru 7)

Today the children will continue a short rotation on the story of Samuel and his call. This short rotation focuses on God's desire to be in relationship with God's people. All throughout the Bible, God uses unlikely people to proclaim his message to Israel. Samuel is one such person, called as a prophet at an early age, God would use Samuel to change the history of Israel.
