Series Continues - Alleluia, alleluia! - Death and New Life Joseph Kelly, Director of Programs, Peter's Place, Radnor, PA

Joseph Kelly has served as the Director of Programs at Peter's Place, Radnor, PA since 2018. Since 2001 Peter's Place has sought to provide safe and supportive environments to grieving children and families and to act as a community resource to foster understanding of the effects of death and grief. Joseph interned at Peter's Place, and was later hired as the first Outreach Coordinator, from 2007–2008. He then spent 10 years working as a mental health therapist at Valley Forge Military Academy and College. Joseph is also employed at Club La Maison, where he is a certified personal trainer. It is here where he runs a small private practice working with teens and young adults, combining exercise and talk therapy. Joseph earned his bachelor's degree in psychology and master's degree in clinical psychology from West Chester University and is licensed in Pennsylvania as a professional counselor.

#### Lenten Book Study (returns)


#### Thursday, May 19 at 7pm Room 217

#### **DID YOU KNOW**

**Did you know** we are very fortunate to have a very organized and intentional plan for our Children's Formation at The Redeemer? Tory Dunkle, with support from Michael Palmisano and the Children and Youth Committee, plans a long-term, three-year rotation of lessons that fall into 4 categories: Scripture, Theology, Liturgy and Vocation. Each week, everyone in Church School (ages 3 through grade 5), hears the same general story/lesson. This provides a synergy between age levels and allows our children to deepen their understanding of key narratives/themes as they grow older. Families with children in the different age groups benefit by being able to discuss the weekly lessons since all the children are learning the same basic content each week. This three-year lesson calendar provides the repetition needed to internalize content, while equipping our children with a strong foundation necessary for a life of faith formation.

#### **CHURCH SCHOOL AND YOUTH MINISTRIES**

Note: Sunday, May 22 marks the last day of the Church School season. Nursery and Children's Chapel will continue throughout the summer during the 9:30am service.

### Lesson for the Day ARK AND THE TEMPLE

#### Preschool - Rm 221 (age 3 to Kindergarten)

This morning we open the Bible and begin to learn the story of the building of the Temple. The children will explore how the way the Israelites experience of God changed when they came into the Promised Land, settled down and built a permanent place to house the Ark of the Covenant.

#### Lower Elementary - Rm 215 (grades 1 to 3)

Building on last week's story of David, today we will explore the significant role the building of the Temple played within David's life (something he never saw come to fruition) and the life of Israel as a whole. Specifically we will explore the ways in which Israel's understanding of God's presence shifted once the Temple was built.

#### Upper Elementary/middle school - Rm 217 (grades 4 thru 7)

Today the children will continue a short rotation on the story of Samuel and his call. Our children have spent a great portion of their time learning the stories of great men and women of the Old Testament. Today we will focus on Samuel's willingness to listen to God's voice.

#### Confirmation - Hospitality Suite

Our confirmands will spend the morning in Norristown with families supported by IHN. After providing lunch the confirmands will receive a poverty simulation from the directors of the IHN program. The class will not meet on Sunday 5/15 but will gather for one final meeting on Sunday 5/22.

#### Redeemer Youth Group - Youth Cottage

RYG will not be meeting this Sunday, 5/15, because many of our youth will be participating in the Redeemer Choir Garden party. We will be meeting May 22nd for our last official meeting.
