End of Church School Season


Today, Sunday, May 21, marks the last day of the Church School season. Nursery and Children's Chapel will continue throughout the summer during the 9:30 service.

Seeing All Things Through the Generosity of Faith

Wednesdays: 7:00 - 8pm

Ask anyone who is not a Christian for a word that describes the Christian faith; "generosity" would probably not be mentioned. Ask anyone who is a member of a church for a word that describes the church's core message, "generosity" probably wouldn't be included. Faith is often described as the discipline of pinching our lives down to a level of moral thinness that would allow us to squeeze through "the narrow gate." This stinginess does not reflect the Gospels nor the expression of faith set out in our worship. Yet we regularly fail to appreciate that faith is our cultivation of seeing God's generosity in all things. In a series of investigations of what is said and done in our liturgies and what is taught by the church, we will explore how it is that generosity is expressive of the very heart of Christianity.

DID YOU KNOW

Did you know the Darby Mission feeds the mind, body and spirit of Darby residents? Doris Rajagopal, who served as a seminarian for a year at Redeemer in 2007, was the minister at an Episcopal Church in Darby. When the church closed, the diocesan bishop agreed to support Doris as she recreated a church without walls. That became the Darby Mission. Our bishop and diocesan staff are an integral factor in the success of the mission. The diocese rents a small house which provides a worship place and gathering spot. Doris works with the local community to feed people through monthly dinners where all are welcome, monthly food giveaways which she personally delivered in lockdown and every Thursday night a small group gathers to worship with an Episcopal service followed by a dinner at the Mission house. Darby Mission has been involved in creating a variety of programs including an after school elementary program and summer camp, cooking classes for teens, and an online weekly Bible study. The mission house is used for a young woman's support group. Darby Mission welcomes everybody, and Doris feels called to build connections and opportunities and does so through the monthly Darby Dinners and a future Youth Mentorship Program. Darby Mission is one of Redeemer's Outreach Grant recipients.

New Name for Outreach Community Services

In an effort to highlight the reciprocal nature of our work, the Outreach Community Services Committee has changed its name to "Community Connections." While we will continue to provide food, meals, shelter, clothing, toiletries, and grants where needed, we will also be emphasizing the importance of creating connections with those who, for all sorts of reasons, would otherwise remain strangers. As Peter Vanderveen pointed out in his May Voice article, it's the work of being present, shifting from "transactional giving to the realization of the mutual benefit gained when we can share God's grace." The rich and the poor have a common bond, the Lord is the maker of them all. (Prov. 22:2)

Caring Collections for St. Gabe's

There has been a noticeable increase in the number of unsheltered individuals coming to the Saturday lunch program at St. Gabriel's Church where, in addition to a meal, they can obtain some legal aid and other assistance. As a way of helping these individuals maintain a sense of health and well-being, St. Gabriel's parishioners offer customized bags of travel size toiletries and grooming items. We can help by donating any of the following: packets of wet wipes, small hand sanitizer, small liquid or cake soap, small shampoo, deodorant, small mouthwash, toothbrush, toothpaste, shaving items, sanitary pads, Band Aids, comb, brush, socks-any size, underwear-any size. A gray hamper in the Parish House hallway is marked for toiletry donations. Please drop off your items through Sunday May 21. They will be taken to St. Gabe's when Jan Clarke and her team deliver their regular meal on Saturday, May 27.

Family Promise of the Main Line (IHN) Guests Return

We'll be hosting FPML families in person in the Parish House! It is a privilege to be able to relate face-to-face and to be present with those who have temporarily lost their homes. Lesson of the Day

Pentecost

Preschool - Rm 221 (age 3 to Kindergarten)

In preparation for Pentecost on May 28, we will celebrate the Feast of Pentecost. Pentecost is the day on which the Holy Spirit was sent by Jesus to the disciples – and now to each of us – bearing gifts that empower us to know, love and serve God and one another.

Lower Elementary - Rm 215 (grades 1 to 3)

We'll celebrate Pentecost a couple weeks early, telling the story of Pentecost from the Book of Acts and rejoicing that the Holy Spirit has been sent to each one of us, bearing gifts that empower us to know and love God and one another.

Upper School - Rm 217 (grades 4 thru 7)

As the Church School year winds down, we will hear the story of the gift of the Holy Spirit in preparation for Pentecost. Through this story will explore the ways in which the Holy Spirit invites each of us to respond and affirm the Christ's redeeming work and grace in this world.
