Roof and Cross Repairs and Restoration



Recently some exciting and much-needed repairs were made to the church. You might have noticed dust and debris raining down from bricks in the arch over the altar. This was caused by water infiltration from damaged masonry on the exterior. A new limestone cross

and base at the peak of the roof gable at the end of the nave (over where the choir usually sits inside) were crumbling and have been replaced to match the old. Masons also repaired the gable and masonry under the roof eaves to help keep water out of the church. Repairs will continue next week with work at the top of the tower and cleaning masonry inside the church.

Did you know the Darby Mission (with which The Redeemer has a long-standing relationship), under the leadership of The Rev. Dr. Doris Rajagopal is finishing up its 2nd year of an after-school program for middle school girls? The Darby Mission hosts middle school girls three days a week for activities which include everything from arts and crafts and cooking to writing activities and treasure hunts to mindfulness and yoga. The purpose of the program is for these young women to have a place of stability and love, and gain trust and confidence as they navigate the daily challenges of their ages and their unstable and traumatic environment. The program has been so successful that next fall the recent middle school graduates will mentor the incoming 6th graders. All of this has been accomplished with a minimal staff and a lot of dedication and belief that these young women have endless potential, if they can believe in themselves.
